29 SECTION 4. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. MATH & 30 31 SCIENCE SCHOOL FUND TRANSFER. 11 SECTION 20. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. EAST 12 13 FUNDING PROVISION. Of the total amount appropriated for Technology Grants 14 each fiscal year, an amount of not less than one million dollars (\$1,000,000) 15 or eighteen percent (18%), whichever is greater each fiscal year, shall be 16 awarded through a grant or professional services contract for EAST 17 infrastructure personal services and operating expenses. The EAST 18 infrastructure grant or contract for personal services and operating expenses 19 shall be awarded to an entity that has personnel or experience, or both, in implementing the EAST Initiative. 20

20 SECTION 28. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General 21 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the 22 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the 23 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the app<u>ropriations in this Act are provided</u>, and that 24 the General Assembly recognizes the important contribution to education made 25 26 by the Pygmalion Commission on Nontraditional Education, and that recognizing 27 and identifying how the educational system is failing a child early enough to 28 provide meaningful intervention is necessary to improve the educational 29 outcomes for at-risk students, and the Pygmalion Commission shall expire on 30 June 30, 2003 unless the General Assembly continues the Commission by further act, and that Section 24 of this Act shall become effective immediately upon 31 32 its passage and approval, and that the General Assembly further recognizes 33 the financial hardships placed on school district resources if the required 34 salary increase authorized by The Educator Compensation Act of 2001 is to 35 continue, and that Section 25 of this Act shall become effective immediately upon its passage and approval due to the economic downturn of state revenues 36
