24	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:	
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26	SECTION 1. Intent.	
27	(a) The General Assembly recognizes:	
28	(1) The importance of adequate eye and vision care for school	
29	age children as an important component to maximizing their educational	
30	opportunities and classroom performance; and	
31	(2) The need for a study to be conducted to evaluate eye and	
32	vision care in school age children and to develop a strategic statewide plan	<u>n</u>
33	regarding the needs and solutions of eye and vision problems of school age

35	(b) Therefore, the purposes of this act are to create a commission to	
36	conduct such a study and to make findings and recommendations to the General	1



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1	Assembly and the Governor.
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3	SECTION 2. Arkansas Commission on Eye and Vision Care of School Age
4	Children.
5	(a)(1) There is established the Arkansas Commission on Eye and Vision
6	Care of School Age Children to be composed of seventeen (17) members.
7	(2) The following members shall be appointed by the Governor:
8	(A) Four (4) optometrists;
9	(B) Two (2) ophthalmologists;
10	(C) One (1) pediatrician;
11	(D) One (1) school nurse who is currently working in a
12	public elementary school in this state;
13	(E) One (1) person currently working as a principal in a
14	public elementary school in this state; and
15	(F) One (1) person currently working as a classroom
16	teacher in a public elementary school in this state.
17	(3) The following members shall be appointed by the Speaker of
18	the House of Representatives:
19	(A) One (1) family practice physician; and
20	(B) One (1) principal of a public elementary school.
21	(4) The following members shall be appointed by the President
22	Pro Tempore of the Senate:
23	(A) One (1) family practice physician; and
24	(B) One (1) teacher in a public elementary school.
25	(5) The chairperson of the House Committee on Public Health,
26	Welfare, and Labor shall appoint one (1) member who has a child in a public
27	school in this state.
28	(6) The chairperson of the Senate Committee on Public Health,
29	Welfare, and Labor shall appoint one (1) member who has a child in a public
30	school in this state.
31	(7) The optometrist serving on the State Board of Health shall
32	also be a member of the board and shall serve as a liaison to the Department
33	of Health.
34	(b)(1) The Governor shall designate one (1) of the optometrist
35	appointees to serve as chairperson of the commission.
36	(2) The members of the commission shall select from their

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1	membership, a vice chairperson, a secretary, and a treasurer.
2	(c) The first meeting shall be held within thirty (30) days of the
3	appointment of the members by the Governor, and shall be called by the
4	chairperson.
5	(d)(1) A majority of the membership of the commission shall constitute
6	a quorum.
7	(2) A majority vote of those members present shall be required
8	for any action of the commission.
9	(e) Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired portion of the term in
10	the same manner as is provided in this section for initial appointments.
11	(f) To the extent that moneys are made available for that purpose, the
12	members of the commission may receive expense reimbursement in accordance
13	with Arkansas Code § 25-16-902.

15	SECTION 3. Duties.
16	(a) The commission shall:
17	(1) Study the eye and vision needs of the school age children of
18	Arkansas;
19	(2) Study and evaluate vision screening programs in the schools,
20	and their effectiveness;
21	(3) Study and evaluate whether children are receiving adequate
22	eye and vision care, and correction of vision problems;
23	(4) Study the effects of inadequate vision on the performance of
24	children in the classroom; and
25	(5) Develop a strategic statewide plan to ensure adequate eye
26	and vision care of school age children.
27	(b) By November 1, 2004, the commission shall report its findings and
28	strategic plan for meeting the vision needs of school age children to the
29	Governor, the Legislative Council, and the House and Senate Interim
30	Committees on Public Health, Welfare, and Labor.
31	
32	SECTION 4. Funding.
33	(a)(1) The commission's funding shall be from grants, donations, and
34	any other funds that may be made available through appropriations by the
35	General Assembly.
36	(2) Moneys received by the commission shall be used solely for

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1	the support of the functions of the commission.
2	(b)(1) Grants and donations received by the commission shall be cash
3	funds and shall be administered by the Arkansas Department of Health but
4	shall be subject to appropriation by the General Assembly.
5	(2) Any moneys received from grantors and donors that are not
6	expended by the commission shall be returned to the grantors and donors in
7	proportion that each bears to the total of all grants and donations received
8	by the commission.
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10	SECTION 5. The commission shall expire on June 30, 2005.
