8	15-20-1003. Definitions.
9	As used in this subchapter:
10	(1) "Commission" means the Arkansas Soil and Water Conservation
11	Commission;
12	(2) "Crop" means any vegetative cover;
13	(3) "Director" means the Executive Director of the Arkansas Soil and
14	Water Conservation Commission;
15	(4) "Litter" means byproducts associated with the confinement of
16	livestock, including excrement, feed wastes, bedding materials, composted
17	carcasses, and any combinations thereof;
18	(5) "Livestock" means animals kept or raised for use or pleasure,
19	especially farm animals kept for use and profit, including horses, cattle,
20	swine, and poultry;
21	(6)(A) "Nutrient" means a substance or recognized plant nutrient,
22	element or compound which is used or sold for its plant nutritive content or
23	its claimed nutritive value.
24	(B) "Nutrient" includes litter, compost as fertilizer,
25	commercially manufactured chemical or organic fertilizers, sewage sludge, or
26	combinations thereof;
27	(7) "Nutrient applicator" means any person who applies nutrients to
28	soil or associated crops;
29	(8) "Nutrient application" means the process by which humans apply
30	nutrients to soil or associated crops;
31	(9) "Nutrient management plan" means any plan prepared to assist
32	landowners and operators in the proper management and utilization of nutrient
33	sources for maximum soil fertility and protection of the waters of the state;
34	(10) "Nutrient surplus area" means an area, under § 15-20-1104, in
35	which the soil concentration of one (1) or more nutrients is so high or the
36	physical characteristics of the soil or area is such that continued

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1	application of the nutrient to the soil could negatively impact soil
2	fertility and the waters of the state;
3	(11) "Person" means any natural person; and
4	(12) "Waters of the state" means all streams, lakes, marshes, ponds,
5	watercourses, waterways, wells, springs, irrigation systems, drainage
6	systems, and all other bodies or accumulations of water, surface and
7	underground, natural or artificial, public or private, that are contained
8	within, flow through, or border upon this state or any portion of the state.

10	15-20-1004. Nutrient planner program.
11	(a) The Arkansas Soil and Water Conservation Commission shall develop
12	and implement a nutrient management education, training, and certification
13	program to certify the minimal competence and knowledge of a person preparing
14	<u>a nutrient management plan.</u>
15	(b)(1) The planner certification program is voluntary for planners who
16	develop plans outside nutrient surplus areas.
17	(2) The commission may not require nutrient planners to become
18	certified unless the planner intends to develop plans for areas within
19	nutrient surplus areas or the plans or the components of the plans are to be
20	paid in whole or part by federal or state funds.
21	(c) The commission shall promulgate regulations that:
22	(1) Specify qualifications and standards for a person to be
23	deemed competent in nutrient management plan preparation, and providing for
24	the issuance of documentation of certification to the person;
25	(2) Specify the conditions under which a certification issued

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1	(a) The Arkansas Soil and Water Conservation Commission shall develop
2	and implement a nutrient applicator training and certification program to
3	certify the competence and knowledge of a person making nutrient application,
4	including the proper utilization of litter.
5	(b)(1) The applicator certification program is voluntary for
6	applicators that apply nutrients outside nutrient surplus areas.
7	(2) The commission may not require nutrient applicators to
8	become certified unless the applicator intends to apply nutrients within
9	nutrient surplus areas or otherwise utilize litter produced within nutrient
10	surplus areas.
11	(c) The commission shall promulgate regulations that:
12	(1) Specify the qualifications and standards for a person to be
13	deemed competent in nutrient application, and provide for the issuance of
14	documentation of certification to the person;
15	(2) Specify the conditions under which a certification issued
16	may be suspended or revoked;
17	(3) Establish fees to be paid by persons enrolling in the
18	training and certification programs; and
19	(4) Provide for the performance of other duties and the exercise
20	of other powers by the Executive Director of the Arkansas Soil and Water

24	<u>15-20-1006.</u> Procedure.
25	(a) The process for the development of regulations and the imposition
26	of administrative penalties shall be conducted pursuant to the Arkansas
27	Administrative Procedure Act, § 25-15-201, et seq.
28	(b) Any records collected by the commission in furtherance of this
29	subchapter that contain information about a specific nutrient management plan
30	or specific nutrient application shall not be made public record.

32	15-20-1007. Disposition of fees and penalties.
33	(a) Fees paid and penalties collected shall be deposited in the
34	Arkansas Water Development Fund and used in furtherance of the nutrient
35	management program, including this subchapter.
36	(b) Fees collected shall be cash funds when received by the Treasurer

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1	of the State and shall not be deposited or deemed to be a part of the State
2	Treasury for the purposes of Arkansas Constitution, Article 5, § 29; Arkansas
3	Constitution, Article 16, §12; Arkansas Constitution, Amendment 20; or any
4	other constitutional or statutory provision.
5	15-20-1008. Administrative penalties.
6	(a) The Arkansas Soil and Water Conservation Commission may impose
7	administrative penalties not to exceed one thousand dollars (\$1,000) per
8	violation against any person violating this subchapter or regulations adopted
9	pursuant to this subchapter.
10	(b) The commission or the director may issue subpoenas under Arkansas
11	Code § 15-22-208.
12	(c) If a person against whom an administrative penalty has been
13	imposed by the commission, as authorized in this section, fails to pay the
14	penalty to the commission, the commission may file an action to collect the
15	administrative penalty in the circuit court of the county in which the person
16	resides.
