(d)(1) Any district that fails to file by April 15 of any given year reports for the first three (3) quarters of that year, as required by subsection (c) of this section, shall have the remainder of its state equalization aid withheld, beginning with the April allotment, and placed in escrow to be released when the reports are received.

(2) A waiver of this subsection (d) may be granted by the department upon petition by a school district.

(e) The State Board of Education shall develop forms and shall promulgate rules, regulations, and procedures as may be required to implement the intent of this section.

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
