## For An Act To Be Entitled

10 AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE

13 COUNTY EDUCATION PROGRAMS IN AGRICULTURE, FAMILY

15 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FOR THE BIENNIAL PERIOD

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27 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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29 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - SUPPORT FOR COUNTY EDUCATION PROGRAMS. There is  
30 hereby appropriated, to the University of Arkansas - Division of Agriculture  
31 - Cooperative Extension Service, to be payable from the General Improvement  
32 Fund or its successor fund or fund accounts, for support of county education  
33 programs in agriculture, family and consumer sciences, 4-H and youth and  
34 community development by the University of Arkansas - Division of Agriculture  
35 - Cooperative Extension Service for the biennial period ending June 30, 2005,

SECTION 2. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY FORWARD. The unexpended balance of appropriation and funds in Section 1 of this Act, which remains on June 30, 2004 shall be carried forward and made available for the same purposes for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2005.

The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2005.

SECTION 3. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, the Higher Education Expenditures Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the

effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003.

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
