2	(2)(A) Arkansas is facing a critical shortage of home care		
3	workers due to the growing numbers of elderly and people with disabilities		
4	who are in need of personal assistance services to remain in their		
5	<pre>communities;</pre>		
6	(B) The state has an obligation to provide public services		
7	in the least restrictive setting consistent with the choice of and		
8	appropriate to the needs of the person being served;		
9	(C) Lack of sufficient home health care services in		
10	Arkansas has resulted in unjustified isolation or segregation of qualified		
11	individuals with disabilities through institutionalization, a form of		
12	disability-based discrimination prohibited by the Americans with Disabilities		
13	Act; and		
14	(D) It is in the best interests of Arkansas and its		
15	citizens that the requirement for a permit of approval for home health care		
16	service agencies be abolished.		
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18	SECTION 2. Purpose and intent.		
19	The purpose of this act is to:		
20	(1) Encourage the availability of a full spectrum of health and		
21	human service options;		
22	(2) Increase the availability of community-based home care		
23	services, including consumer-directed personal care, to allow the elderly and		
24	people with disabilities to remain in their own home; and		
25	(3) Stimulate the development of a variety of innovative home		
26	care worker initiatives, collaborations between state agencies, and community		
27	partnerships to recruit, train, place and support home care workers.		
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29	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 20-8-103(a), concerning the powers and		
30	duties of the Health Services Permit Commission, is amended to read as		
31	follows:		
32	(a) The Health Services Permit Commission shall evaluate the		
33	availability and adequacy of health facilities and health services as they		
34	relate to long-term care facilities and home health care service agencies in		
35	this state.		
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1	SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 20-8-103, concerning the powers and duti		
2	of the Health Services Permit Commission, is amended to add an additional		
3	subsection to read as follows:		
4	(h) The permit of approval process for home health care service		
5	agencies as required under this subchapter is repealed as of the effective		
6	date of this act.		
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8	SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 20-8-106(a), concerning permits issued by		
9	the Health Services program, is amended to add a new subdivision as follow		
10	(4) No permit of approval shall be required by the agency or the		
11	commission for home health care service agencies.		
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
