## For An Act To Be Entitled

AN ACT TO ALLOW CITIES TO ESTABLISH FILING

## Subtitle

AN ACT TO ALLOW CITIES TO ESTABLISH
FILING DEADLINES FOR CANDIDATES THAT ARE
INDEPENDENT OR OTHERWISE NONPARTISAN IN AN ELECTION FOR MUNICIPAL OFFICE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 14-42-206(e), concerning municipal primary elections, is amended to read as follows:
(e) (1) The governing body of any city of the first class, city of the second class, or incorporated town may enact an ordinance requiring independent candidates for municipal office to file petitions for nomination as independent candidates with the county clerk no earlier than twenty (20) days prior to the preferential primary election and no later than noon on the day before the preferential primary election.
(2) The governing body may establish this filing deadline for municipal offices even if the municipal offices are all independent or otherwise nonpartisan.
(2)(3) The ordinance shall be enacted no later than ninety (90) days prior to the filing deadline. The ordinance shall be published at least
once a week for two (2) consecutive weeks immediately following adoption of the ordinance in a newspaper having a general circulation in the city. /s/ Wood
