4	(B) These frameworks, developed by the Department of
5	Education, require student demonstration of the rigorous knowledge and skills
6	necessary to succeed in the state's institutions of post-secondary education
7	or to enter the workforce.
8	(c) The board shall review the plan and revise as necessary based on
9	the five-year cycle for school improvement plans required by the Arkansas
10	Comprehensive Testing, Assessment, and Accountability Program.
11	(d) The superintendent of each school district shall provide to the
12	department, by October 1, 2002, and each year thereafter on that date, a
13	written statement of assurance that the content of each academic subject area
14	course in grades nine through twelve (9-12) is aligned to frameworks
15	developed by the department and required in the plan under subsection (b) of

17	(e) The department shall monitor compliance with the requirements of
18	this section during the Standards for Accreditation of Arkansas Public
19	Schools review visit and during the school improvement planning process as

23	through twelve (9-12) to the frameworks in any school containing a

1	by adding five additional sections to read as follows:
2	6-15-1502. Revisions, compliance, and implementation.
3	(a) The State Board of Education shall develop a comprehensive plan to
4	review and revise the Arkansas Academic Content Standards and Curriculum
5	Frameworks process.
6	(b) The plan shall be a comprehensive plan to provide an external
7	review of content standards and curriculum frameworks adopted by the state in
8	core academic areas of reading, writing, mathematics, science, history,
9	geography, civics, and other courses identified by the State Board of
10	Education as state-mandated graduation requirements.
11	(c) In developing the plan, the board shall conduct a full review of
12	available and relevant academic content standards and curriculum frameworks
13	that are rigorous, specific, sequenced, clear, focused, and measurable,
14	whenever possible.
15	(d)(l) The review shall be to determine if the Arkansas Content
16	Standards and Curriculum Frameworks are designed to: shall:
17	(A) Reflect high expectations for students and an in-depth
18	mastery of the content;
19	(B) Be clearly grounded in the content of each academic
20	area;
21	(C) Be defined grade-by-grade and in each content area;
22	(D) Be understandable to parents and teachers;
23	(E) Be developed in full recognition of the time available
24	to teach the core academic areas at each grade level; and
25	(F) Be measurable, whenever possible, in a reliable,
26	valid, and efficient manner for accountability purposes.
27	(2) The plan shall include a process for the review of

36	(e) Upon completion of the review, the State Board of Education shall

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1	revise all curriculum frameworks and supplemental materials that are
2	recommended as a result of the review.
3	(f) As part of the revision process, the board shall revise and make
4	available to teachers and parents support materials, including teacher and
5	parent guides, for academic content standards and curriculum frameworks that
6	are specifically recommended for revision as a result of the review.
7	(g) The board shall work in collaboration with Arkansas Higher
8	Education Coordinating Board and the Executive Council to ensure that teacher
9	and school administrator degree programs, ongoing professional development,
10	and other university activity in the state's public schools align with the
11	revised Arkansas Academic Content Standards and Curriculum Framework
12	Processes and other educational priorities of the state.

14	6-15-1503. State-mandated exams.
15	(a)(1) The State Board of Education shall ensure that any revisions
16	made to the Arkansas Academic Content Standards and Curriculum Framework

13	(a) Beginning with the 2003-2004 school year, each local school
14	district shall establish procedures and monitoring processes to ensure that
15	the content of each course offered by the district is consistent with content
16	standards and curriculum frameworks developed by the board in the process.
17	(b) The superintendent of each school district shall provide to the
18	Department of Education, by October 1 of each year following the adoption of
19	the plan under subsection (a) of this section, a written statement of
20	assurance that the content of each class and subject area, as required by the
21	Arkansas Standards of Accreditation for Arkansas Public Schools regardless of
22	levels, is aligned to content standards and curriculum frameworks developed
23	by the board in the plan.
24	(c) The department shall monitor, during the standards review visit,
25	documentation related to the plan.
26	(d) If the department determines that a school district has failed to
27	align the content of each class and subject area as required by the State
28	Board of Education to content standards and curriculum frameworks developed

30	(1) Note the failure to comply in the annual school performance
31	report, under § 6-15-1402; and
32	(2) Cite the failure to comply of each school on the Standards
