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2	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
3	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Medicaid Fraud False		
4	Claims Act is in immediate need of these revisions to clarify an ambiguity in		
5	the law; that the provisions of this act are essential to the successful		
6	operation and activities of the Medicaid Fraud Control Unit and the		
7	Department of Human Services. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist		
8	and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public		
9	peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:		
10	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
11	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
12	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
13	bill; or		
14	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
15	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
