36	SECTION 2. EN	MERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determ	ined by the	



1	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the state is experiencing
2	budgetary hardships due to a decline in the economic conditions in the state;
3	that additional revenue is needed for the Arkansas Department of Higher
4	Education to be dedicated to sustaining and funding the Arkansas Academic
5	Challenge Scholarship Program and the Arkansas Governor's Scholars Program,

7	act is immediately necessary to levy additional excise taxes on tobacco
8	products to provide special revenue to secure that future scholarship or
