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1 follows: 2 (19) "Temporary license" means a certificate issued by the board committee authorizing the applicant to use radioactive materials or medical 3 4 equipment emitting or detecting ionizing radiation for humans' human 5 diagnostic or therapeutic purposes when licensure or relicensure is pending 6 before the board committee and when the issuance may be justified by special 7 circumstances as determined by the board committee. 8 9 SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 17-106-105(a)(1), concerning duties and powers of the State Board of Health, is amended to read as follows: 10 11 (a)(1) The State Board of Health is authorized to: 12 (A) Incur whatever expenses it may deem necessary or expedient in performing its duties under the provisions of this chapter. It may employ 13 or engage whatever personnel, legal counsel, independent contractors, or 14 15 assistants it may deem necessary or expedient therefore and fix their 16 compensation; 17 (B) Adopt standards for applicants wishing to take the licensing 18 examination: 19 (C) Grant, deny, renew, suspend, or revoke licenses for any cause stated in this chapter <u>Recognize</u> and <u>license</u> emerging modalities in 20 21 radiological procedures; and (D) Adopt, publish, and, from time to time, revise such rules 22 23 and regulations not inconsistent with the law as may be necessary to enable 24 it to carry into effect the provisions of this chapter. 25 26 SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 17-106-105(b), concerning duties and powers 27 of the State Board of Health, is amended to read as follows: 28 (b) The Medical Ionizing Radiation Licensure Committee is authorized 29 to: 30 (1) Adopt suitable bylaws for carrying out its duties under the 31 provisions of this chapter; 32 (2) Have an official seal that shall bear the words "Medical 33 Ionizing Radiation Licensure Committee"; (3) Provide a secretary's certificate. The certificate of the 34 35 Secretary of the Medical Ionizing Radiation Licensure Committee under seal 36 shall be accepted in the courts of the state as the best evidence as to the

Arkansas Code § 17-106-106(b) and (c), concerning legal 23 title, license limitations, and prohibited acts under the Consumer-Patient 24 Radiation Health and Safety Act, are amended to read as follows: 25 (b) A person holding a license under this chapter shall use 26 radioactive substances or medical equipment emitting or detecting ionizing 27 radiation on a human being by prescription of a licensed practitioner or 28 advanced practice nurse and only if the application of a substance or the use 29 of equipment is limited in a manner herein specified. 30 (c) A person holding a limited license under this chapter shall use 31 medical equipment emitting or detecting ionizing radiation on a human being 32 by prescription of a licensed practitioner or advanced practice nurse and 33 only if the limited licensed technologist is licensed for those specific body 34 parts. 35 SECTION 8. Arkansas Code § 17-106-107(a), concerning licensing 36 requirements under the Consumer-Patient Radiation Health And Safety Act, is

Arkansas Code § 17-106-109 is amended to read as follows: 8 17-106-109.
