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2	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
3	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that revenue available for the		
4	support of necessary state services has declined during the last twelve		
5	months as a result of the nationwide economic slow down; that without		
6	additional revenue some state services will be reduced or eliminated; that		
7	some Arkansans will suffer as a result of service reductions or cuts; and		
8	that this bill will provide the necessary revenue to avoid state service		
9	reductions or cuts. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this		
10	act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,		
11	health and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2003.		
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
