9	HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION
10	URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO PERMANENTLY
11	REPEAL THE DEATH TAX.

14	URGING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO
15	PERMANENTLY REPEAL THE DEATH TAX.

18	WHEREAS, under tax relief legislation passed in 2001, the Death Tax was
19	temporarily phased out, but not permanently eliminated; and
20	
21	WHEREAS, women and minorities are often owners of small and medium-
22	sized businesses, and the death tax prevents the children of small and
23	medium-sized business owners from reaping the rewards of the lifetime that
24	their parents spent to try to make a better life for their children; and
25	
26	WHEREAS, farmers and other small business owners will face losing their
27	farms and businesses if the federal government resumes the heavy taxation of
28	citizens at death; and
29	
30	WHEREAS, employees suffer when they lose their jobs when small and
31	medium-sized businesses are liquidated to pay death taxes and because high
32	capital costs depress the number of new businesses that could offer them a
33	job; and

35	WHEREAS, if the estate tax had been repealed in 1996, over the next
36	nine (9) years, the economy of the United States would have averaged as much



as eleven billion dollars (\$11,000,000,000) per year in extra output, and an average of one hundred forty-five thousand (145,000) additional new jobs would have been created; and WHEREAS, the persistent uncertainty created by the sunset provision in the federal law prevents families and small businesses from taking advantage of the temporary repeal; and WHEREAS, having repeatedly passed both the United States House of Representatives and Senate, the elimination of the death tax has been proven to have broad bipartisan support, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN: That the United States Congress is urged to support, work to pass, and vote for the immediate and permanent repeal of the death tax. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon the adoption of this resolution the Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives shall transmit a copy to each member of Arkansas' Congressional Delegation and the presiding officer of the United States House of Representatives and the United States Senate.
