14	RESOLUTION TO ENCOURAGE CONGRESS TO PASS
15	LEGISLATION REQUIRING THE COLLECTION OF
16	STATE SALES AND USE TAX BY REMOTE

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20	WHEREAS, forty-five states and the District of Columbia impose a sales
21	and use tax; and
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23	WHEREAS, local merchants are facing unfair competition from remote
24	sellers located outside Arkansas who do not collect sales and use tax on
25	their sales to Arkansas customers; and
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27	WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court in Quill v. North Dakota has
28	ruled that states cannot require remote vendors that do not have substantial
29	nexus with their state to collect state sales and use tax; and
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31	WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court in Quill ruled that Congress
32	is free under the Commerce Clause to allow the states to impose tax
33	obligations on taxpayers even when they do not have substantial nexus with a
34	particular taxing jurisdiction; and
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36	WHEREAS exponential increases in remote sales has reduced sales and



1	use tax revenue for all states; and
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3	WHEREAS, there is no economic reason to justify treating electronic
4	commerce or other forms of remote commerce more favorably than any other form
5	of commerce; and
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7	WHEREAS, sound tax policy demands that all forms of commerce be treated
8	equally; and
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10	WHEREAS, a national initiative, the Streamlined Sales Tax Project, is
11	underway to adopt a uniform system of sales and use tax administration that
12	would greatly reduce the burden on remote sellers and facilitate interstate
13	commerce; and
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15	WHEREAS, technological advances have greatly reduced the burden on
16	remote sellers; and

18	WHEREAS, the State of Arkansas is opposed to legislation that would
19	link federal restrictions on state authority to levy business activity taxes
20	to the implementation of an expanded duty for remote sellers to collect sales
21	and use taxes, and
23	WHEREAS, a trade-off between state business activity tax authority and
24	sales and use tax authority undermines federalism and erodes the equity and
25	effectiveness of business activity taxes; and

27	WHEREAS, Arkansas calls on Congress to re-establish fairness in state
28	sales and use tax systems by requiring remote sellers making sales above a
29	reasonable threshold level to collect sales and use taxes for any state that
30	simplifies its tax system in accordance with the standards established by the
31	Streamlined Sales and Use Tax Agreement,
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33	NOW THEREFORE,
34	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FOURTH GENERAL
35	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

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1	That Congress is urged to recognize the value of the Streamlined Sales
2	Tax Agreement to individual state tax systems and to the state sales and use
3	tax structure that must operate in our national and international economy;
4	and
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6	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Congress is encouraged to recognize that
7	the requirements for the collection of state sales and use tax should not
8	require adoption of specified standards of nexus for other types of state and
9	local taxes, but should provide that collection and remittance of sales and
10	use taxes, in and of itself, would not be considered a factor in determining
11	nexus for other state and local taxes;
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13	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Congress should commit itself to achieving
14	equity in sales and use tax collection by authorizing states, in advance, but
15	subject to congressional veto, to require collection of the tax by remote
16	sellers that exceed a de minimis sales threshold, the authorization taking
17	effect automatically once a critical mass of states have implemented the
18	simplifications outlined by the Streamlined Sales Tax Agreement; and
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20	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon the adoption of this resolution the
21	Chief Clerk of the House of Representatives shall transmit a copy to each
22	member of Arkansas' Congressional Delegation and the presiding officer of the
23	United States House of Representatives and the United States Senate.
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
