19	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FOURTH GENERAL
20	ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS AND BY THE SENATE, A MAJORITY OF ALL
21	MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:

23	That the following is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of
24	the State of Arkansas, and upon being submitted to the electors of the state
25	for approval or rejection at the next general election for Representatives
26	and Senators, if a majority of the electors voting thereon at the election,
27	adopt the amendment, the amendment shall become a part of the Constitution of
28	the State of Arkansas, to wit:

30	SECTION 1. Article 5, Section 5 of the Constitution of the State of
31	Arkansas is amended to read as follows:
32	§ 5. Time of meeting.
33	The General Assembly shall meet <u>in regular session</u> at the seat of
34	government every two years on the first Tuesday after the second Monday in
35	November until said time be altered at such time as provided by law.

1	SECTION 2. Article 5, Section 17 of the Constitution of the State of
2	Arkansas is amended to read as follows:
3	§ 17. Duration of sessions.
4	The regular biennial sessions <u>General Assembly shall meet in regular</u>
5	session each year and the sessions shall not exceed sixty days thirty (30)
6	calendar days in duration, unless by a vote of two-thirds of the members
7	elected to each house of said General Assembly. Provided, that this section
8	shall not apply to the first session of the General Assembly under this
9	Constitution, or when impeachments are pending.
10	
11	SECTION 3. This amendment becomes effective on January 1, 2005.
