4	(b)(1) The General Assembly may by law define lottery and provide for		
5	the operation and regulation of a lottery or lotteries by or on behalf of the		
6	state, and for any matters relating to the purposes or provisions of this		
7	subsection.		
8	(2) Proceeds derived from the lottery or lotteries operated by		
9	or on behalf of the state shall be deposited into financial institutions		
10	other than the State Treasury and used to pay the operating expenses of the		
11	lottery or lotteries, including all prizes, without any appropriation		
12	required by law, and to supplement, not supplant, appropriations provided by		
13	the General Assembly for educational programs and educational purposes, and
