BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this recognition does not authorize the establishment of any smoke shops of any kind, does not authorize the establishment of any tribal casinos or gaming of any kind, does not authorize the establishment of any pari-mutuel waging, and does not give the Northern Cherokee Nation of Missouri and Arkansas, as an organization, any additional rights or powers other than those contained in the Arkansas Constitution. /s/ Judy, et al
