18	STATES SENATORS OF THE STATE OF ARKANSS
19	SUPPORT THE FLOOR VOTE AND NOMINATION OF
20	JUDICIAL NOMINEE MIGUEL ESTRADA.

22	WHEREAS, on May 9, 2001, President Bush nominated Miguel A. Estrada to
23	fill a vacancy on the United States Court of Appeals for the District of
24	Columbia Circuit; and

26	WHEREAS, Mr. Estrada's credentials go uncontested beginning with his
27	mastery of the English language and American culture upon his arrival to the
28	United States as an immigrant from Honduras, his graduation magna cum laude
29	from Columbia University, and his graduation from Harvard Law School; and

31	WHEREAS, over a year and a half has passed without a vote on the Senate
32	floor regarding the nomination of Miguel A. Estrada; and

34	WHEREAS, the Senate Judiciary committee has issued a favorable report
35	to the United States Senate; yet because of partisan politics, Democratic
36	Senators threaten to filibuster a Senate floor vote; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Estrada has received support from liberal and conservative colleagues alike who attest that he is one of the most brilliant and effective appellate lawyers in the country; and WHEREAS, organizations that support Mr. Estrada include the League of Latin American Citizens, the United States Hispanic Chamber of Commerce, Hispanic National Bar Association, Hispanic Business Roundtable, and The Latino Coalition; and WHEREAS, Mr. Estrada would be the first Hispanic in the country to sit on the United States Court of Appeals, District of Columbia Circuit, which is an important and prestigious position within the nation's Court of Appeals, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE EIGHTY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: THAT the House of Representatives of the State of Arkansas requests that our Senators in the United States Congress work to allow a vote on the floor of the United States Senate on the appointment of Miguel Estrada to the United States Court of Appeals, District of Columbia Circuit. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon adoption of this resolution, the Chief Clerk of the Arkansas House of Representatives shall transmit copies to each of our United States Senators and the presiding officer of the United States Senate.
