| 20 | General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that certain state employees with         |
| 21 | severe illnesses are being denied time off to deal with those illnesses; that       |
| 22 | the employees are in dire need of relief from the strict requirements of the        |
| 23 | catastrophic leave law; that by denying them the time off an unnecessary            |
| 24 | hardship has befallen those public employees; and that this act is                  |
| 25 | immediately necessary because of the immediate need for time off for those          |
| 26 | employees. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being          |
| 27 | immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and          |
| 28 | safety shall become effective on:   |
