The 4 levels are to be known and are referred to as "psychological examiner" and 5 "psychologist": 6 (1)(A) A person practices as a "psychological examiner" within 7 the meaning of this chapter when he or she holds himself or herself out to be 8 a psychological examiner or renders to individuals or to the public for 9 remuneration any service involving the application of recognized principles, methods, and procedures of the science and profession of psychology the 10 11 practice of psychology. 12 (B) Psychological examiners independently provide services 13 such as interviewing or administering and interpreting tests of mental abilities, aptitudes, interests, and personality characteristics for the 14 15 purposes of psychological evaluation to assist in the determination of 16 educational or vocational selection, guidance, or placement. 17 (C) The psychological examiner practices the following only under the supervision of a qualified psychologist: 18 19 (i) Overall personality appraisal, including 20 projective and objective testing classification of mental health disorders; 21 (ii) Personality counseling; 22 (iii) Psychotherapy; 23 (iv) Neuropsychological evaluation; or 24 (v) Personality readjustment techniques; and 25 (C) Other than those psychological services listed in 26 subdivision (b)(1)(B) of this section, the psychological examiner provides psychological services only under the supervision of a qualified 27 28 psychologist. 29 (2) A person practices as a "psychologist" within the meaning of 30 this chapter when he or she holds himself or herself out to be a psychologist or renders to individuals or to the public for remuneration any service 31 32 involving the application of recognized principles, methods, and procedures 33 of the science and profession of psychology, such as interviewing or 34 administering and interpreting tests of mental abilities, aptitudes, 35 interests, and personality characteristics for such purposes as psychological 36 evaluation or for educational or vocational selection, guidance, or

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1	placement, or for such purposes as overall personality appraisal or

23	private schools, clergymen, practitioners of medicine, or social workers from

Arkansas Code § 17-97-201(a), concerning creation and 2 membership of the Arkansas Board of Examiners in Psychology, is amended to 3 read as follows: 4 (a)(1) There is created the Arkansas Board of Examiners in Psychology 5 Arkansas Psychology Board, which shall consist of <del>eight (8)</del> nine (9) members 6 who shall be appointed by the Governor for terms of five (5) years. 7 (2) The Governor shall appoint: 8 (A) Two (2) academic psychologists One (1) academic 9 psychologist engaged in full-time teaching, except that when a vacancy arises 10 in an academic psychologist position after March 1, 1995, that academic 11 psychologist position is abolished, and thereafter, an additional 12 psychological examiner engaged in the full-time practice of psychology shall be appointed to the board of psychology at the graduate level at an approved 13 institute of higher learning or holding an active faculty appointment in an 14 15 American Psychological Association approved pre or post doctoral internship 16 program; 17 (B)(i) Three (3) Four (4) practicing psychologists engaged in the full-time practice of psychology with at least one (1) psychologist 18 19 engaged in the full-time, private practice of psychology. (ii) The Governor shall ensure that the psychologist 20 members reflect a diversity of practice specialties, including but not be 21 22 limited to, clinical psychology, counseling psychology, health psychology, 23 neuropsychology, and school psychology; 24 (C) One (1) psychological examiner Two (2) psychological 25 examiners engaged in the full-time practice of psychology, except that, as 26 provided in subdivision (a)(2)(A) of this section, when a vacancy arises in 27 an academic psychologist position after March 1, 1995, that academic 28 psychologist position is abolished, and thereafter, an additional 29 psychological examiner engaged in the full-time practice of psychology shall 30 be appointed to the board, and from then on, two (2) psychological examiners 31 shall serve on the board; and 32 (D) Two (2) persons who are not actively engaged in or 33 retired from the practice of psychology who shall be voting members at-large. 34 (3)(A)(i) The academic *psychologists* psychologist, and the 35 practicing psychologists, and psychological examiners shall be appointed from 36 a list of nominees provided by the Arkansas Psychological Association, the

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1 (a) Any person wishing to obtain the right to practice as a 2 psychologist in this state who has not heretofore been licensed to do so 3 shall make application to the Arkansas Board of Examiners in Psychology 4 Arkansas Psychology Board through the Chair of the Arkansas Board of 5 Examiners in Psychology Arkansas Psychology Board in a form and in a manner 6 as shall be adopted and prescribed by the board and obtain from the board a 7 license to do so. 8 9 SECTION 9. Arkansas Code § 17-97-303 is amended to read as follows: 10 17-97-303. Psychological examiners - Application - Qualifications. 11 (a) Any person wishing to obtain the right to practice as a 12 psychological examiner who has not heretofore been licensed to do so shall make application to the Arkansas Board of Examiners in Psychology Arkansas 13 14 Psychology Board through the chair of the Arkansas Board of Examiners in 15 Psychology Arkansas Psychology Board upon a form and in the manner as shall 16 be adopted and prescribed by the board and shall obtain from the board a 17 license to do so. Reciprocity. 2 At its discretion, the Arkansas Board of Examiners in Psychology Arkansas Psychology Board may grant a certificate without an assembled 3 4 examination to any person residing or employed in the state who at the time 5 of application is licensed or certified by a similar board of another state 6 whose standards, in the opinion of the board, are not lower than those 7 required by this chapter or who has been practicing psychology in another 8 state and has qualifications not lower than those required by this chapter 9 and is able to satisfy the board that to grant him or her a license would be 10 in the public interest. 11 12 SECTION 13. Arkansas Code § 17-97-308(a), concerning annual registration and failure to reregister licenses to practice psychology, is 13 14 amended to read as follows: 15 The Arkansas Board of Examiners in Psychology shall have authority (a) 16 to Arkansas Psychology Board may adopt and enforce rules and regulations 17 requiring every person having a license to practice to pay an annual 18 registration fee in a sum to be fixed by the board. 19 20 SECTION 14. Arkansas Code § 17-97-309, concerning fees charged by the Arkansas Board of Examiners in Psychology, is amended to read as follows: 21 22 (a)(1) There shall be paid to the Chair of the Arkansas Board of 23 Examiners in Psychology Arkansas Psychology Board by each applicant for a 24 permanent license an application fee of two hundred dollars (\$200). 25 (2) An additional fee to be determined by the Arkansas Board of 26 Examiners in Psychology Arkansas Psychology Board, but in no event to exceed 27 the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100), shall be paid as deemed necessary to 28 defray the cost of acquiring and administering the examination test and 29 related expenses in connection therewith. 30 SECTION 15. Arkansas Code § 17-97-310(a), concerning various actions 31 32 of the Arkansas Board of Examiners in Psychology in regard to licensure, is 33 amended to read as follows: 34 The Arkansas Board of Examiners in Psychology Arkansas Psychology (a) 35 Board may refuse to grant a certificate or may suspend or revoke any license

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for a period to be determined by the board, may impose a fine of up to five

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1 thousand dollars (\$5,000), may issue a letter of reprimand, and may require 2 additional hours of education of a licensee on the following grounds: (1) The employment of fraud or deception in applying for a 3 4 license or in passing the examination provided for in this chapter; 5 (2) The practice of psychology under a false or assumed name or 6 the impersonation of another practitioner of a like or different name; 7 (3) Habitual intemperance in the use of ardent spirits, 8 narcotics, or stimulants to such an extent as to incapacitate the licensee or 9 applicant for the performance of his or her duties; 10 (4) Violation of the Arkansas Medical Practices Act, §§ 17-95-11 201 - 17-95-207, 17-95-301 - 17-95-305, and 17-95-401 - 17-95-411; 12 (5) Practice of a level of psychology inappropriate to the 13 particular license held by the licentiate; 14 (6) Upon recommendation of the ethics committee of the Arkansas 15 Psychological Association or of the American Psychological Association; 16 (7) Negligence or wrongful actions in the performance of his or 17 her duties: or 18 (8) A violation of any rule or regulation of this board or the 19 rules of ethics as adopted by this board. 20 21 SECTION 16. Arkansas Code 17-97-311(a), concerning investigative 22 proceedings by the Arkansas Board of Examiners in Psychology, is amended to 23 read as follows: 24 (a)(1)(A) The Arkansas Psychology Board may investigate or cause to be 25 investigated any allegation or evidence that appears to show that a person: 26 (i) Is practicing psychology without a license; or 27 (ii) A person licensed to practice in Arkansas, and 28 anyone under his or her supervision is, or may be, in violation of this 29 chapter or of any of the rules and regulations adopted by the board. 30 (B) Any individual selected by the board to conduct an investigation shall be someone not licensed by the board and without any 31 32 real, or apparent, conflict of interest that might disqualify the individual 33 as an impartial and nonbiased investigator. (C) A licensee subjected to investigation shall be 34 35 notified before the investigation begins and may select a licensed peer of equivalent qualifications to serve on the board's panel of claims 36

2	<u>(2)</u> The Arkansas Board of Examiners in Psychology board may not
3	recommend suspension, revocation, or any other penalty described in § 17-97-
4	310 affecting a certificate or license or refuse to issue or to renew any
5	certificate for any cause listed in this chapter unless the person accused
6	has been given at least twenty (20) days' notice in writing by registered
7	mail, with return receipt demanded, of the charges against the person and an
8	opportunity for a public hearing by the board.
9	$\frac{(2)}{(3)}$ The written notice shall be mailed to the person's last
10	known address, but the nonappearance of the person shall not prevent such a
11	hearing.

13	SECTION 17. Arkansas Code § 17-97-312(a), concerning criminal
14	background checks for the Arkansas Board of Examiners in Psychology, is
15	amended to read as follows:
16	(a) Each first-time applicant for a license issued by the Arkansas
17	<del>Board of Examiners in Psychology</del> <u>Arkansas Psychology Board</u> shall be required
18	to apply to the Identification Bureau of the Department of Arkansas State
19	Police for a state and national criminal background check to be conducted by
20	the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
