30 <u>(2)</u> An additional fee to be determined by the Arkansas Board of 31 Examiners in Psychology Arkansas Psychology Board, but in no event to exceed 32 the sum of one hundred dollars (\$100), shall be paid as deemed necessary to 33 defray the cost of acquiring and administering the examination test and 34 related expenses in connection therewith.

SECTION 15. Arkansas Code § 17-97-310(a), concerning various actions

1 of the Arkansas Board of Examiners in Psychology in regard to licensure, is 2 amended to read as follows: 3 (a) The Arkansas Board of Examiners in Psychology Arkansas Psychology 4 Board may refuse to grant a certificate or may suspend or revoke any license 5 for a period to be determined by the board, may impose a fine of up to five 6 thousand dollars (\$5,000), may issue a letter of reprimand, and may require 7 additional hours of education of a licensee on the following grounds: 8 (1) The employment of fraud or deception in applying for a 9 license or in passing the examination provided for in this chapter; (2) The practice of psychology under a false or assumed name or 10 11 the impersonation of another practitioner of a like or different name; 12 (3) Habitual intemperance in the use of ardent spirits, narcotics, or stimulants to such an extent as to incapacitate the licensee or 13 14 applicant for the performance of his or her duties; 15 (4) Violation of the Arkansas Medical Practices Act, §§ 17-95-16 201 - 17-95-207, 17-95-301 - 17-95-305, and 17-95-401 - 17-95-411; 17 (5) Practice of a level of psychology inappropriate to the particular license held by the licentiate; 18 19 (6) Upon recommendation of the ethics committee of the Arkansas Psychological Association or of the American Psychological Association; 20 21 (7) Negligence or wrongful actions in the performance of his or 22 her duties; or 23 (8) A violation of any rule or regulation of this board or the 24 rules of ethics as adopted by this board. 25 26 SECTION 16. Arkansas Code 17-97-311(a), concerning investigative 27 proceedings by the Arkansas Board of Examiners in Psychology, is amended to 28 read as follows: 29 (a)(1)(A) The Arkansas Psychology Board may investigate or cause to be 30 investigated any allegation or evidence that appears to show that a person: 31 (i) Is practicing psychology without a license; or 32 (ii) A person licensed to practice in Arkansas, and 33 anyone under his or her supervision is, or may be, in violation of this chapter or of any of the rules and regulations adopted by the board. 34 35 (B) Any individual selected by the board to conduct an investigation shall be someone not licensed by the board and without any 36

1	real, or apparent, conflict of interest that might disqualify the individual
2	as an impartial and nonbiased investigator.
2	(C) A licensee subjected to investigation shall be
4	notified before the investigation begins and may select a licensed peer of
5	equivalent qualifications to serve on the board's panel of claims
6	investigations.
7	(2) The Arkansas Board of Examiners in Psychology board may not
8	recommend suspension, revocation, or any other penalty described in § 17-97-
9	310 affecting a certificate or license or refuse to issue or to renew any
10	certificate for any cause listed in this chapter unless the person accused
11	has been given at least twenty (20) days' notice in writing by registered
12	mail, with return receipt demanded, of the charges against the person and an
13	opportunity for a public hearing by the board.
14	$\frac{(2)}{(3)}$ The written notice shall be mailed to the person's last
15	known address, but the nonappearance of the person shall not prevent such a
16	hearing.

18	SECTION 17. Arkansas Code § 17-97-312(a), concerning criminal
19	background checks for the Arkansas Board of Examiners in Psychology, is
20	amended to read as follows:
21	(a) Each first-time applicant for a license issued by the Arkansas
22	Board of Examiners in Psychology Arkansas Psychology Board shall be required
23	to apply to the Identification Bureau of the Department of Arkansas State
24	Police for a state and national criminal background check to be conducted by
25	the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
