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20	SECTION 1. The Office of Arkansas State Arts and Humanities is rena	med
21	the Arkansas Arts Council.	
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23	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 13-8-101 is amended to read as follows:	
24	13-8-101. Title.	
25	This subchapter shall be known as the "Arkansas State Arts and	
26	Humanities Act of 1971".	
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28	SECTION 3. Arkansas Code § 13-8-102 is amended to read as follows:	
29	13-8-102. Definitions.	
30	As used in this subchapter, unless the context otherwise requires:	
31	(1) "Agency" means the Arkansas Arts Council established in t	<u>his</u>
32	subchapter. The agency shall include the advisory council and the position	<u>n</u>

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35	(1) (2) "Group" includes any state or other public agency and	any

29	rendition of the arts and meeting any standards as may be approved by the

31	(4) "Project" means:
32	(A) Programs organized to carry out the purposes of this
33	subchapter, including programs:
34	(i) To foster artistic creativity;

32	(6) "The office" means the Office of Arkansas State Arts and
33	Humanities established in this subchapter. The office shall include the
34	advisory council and the position of executive director as established in
35	this subchapter.

- SECTION 4. Arkansas Code § 13-8-103 is amended to read as follows: 13-8-103. Establishment and composition.
 - (a) There is established the Office of Arkansas State Arts and Humanities Arkansas Arts Council as a separate and distinct office agency under the laws of the State of Arkansas and under the jurisdiction and supervision of the Department of Arkansas Heritage.
 - (b) The office agency shall consist of an advisory council and an executive director. The advisory council shall be charged with the responsibility of developing and implementing a comprehensive statewide program for the support of the arts and humanities in Arkansas, pursuant to this subchapter. The executive director shall be charged with the duty of administering the provisions of this subchapter and the rules, regulations, and orders established thereunder.

- SECTION 5. Arkansas Code § 13-8-104 is amended to read as follows: 16 13-8-104. Advisory council - Members.
 - Humanities Arkansas Arts Council shall consist of seventeen (17) members appointed by the Governor and selected by reason of their widely recognized knowledge and interest in the arts and humanities; two (2) members shall be selected from each of the eight (8) planning and development districts of the State of Arkansas and one (1) member shall be selected at large.
 - (b) The term of office for each member shall be four (4) years beginning July 1 of the year of appointment, until a successor has been appointed and qualified for the office.
 - (c) A vacancy shall be filled for the remainder of the term only.
 - (d) Members may be reappointed to consecutive terms of office.
 - (e) The advisory council shall from time to time select from its membership a chairman chairperson and a vice-chairman vice-chairperson.
 - (f) No member of the advisory council shall receive pay for his <u>or her</u> services, but members may receive expense reimbursement in accordance with § 25-16-901 et seq § 25-16-902.

- 34 SECTION 6. Arkansas Code § 13-8-105 is amended to read as follows: 35 13-8-105. Executive director.
- 36 (a) The Executive Director of the Office of Arkansas State Arts and

- 1 Humanities Arkansas Arts Council shall be appointed by the Governor. He
- 2 shall be the ex officio secretary of the Advisory Council of the Office of
- Arkansas State Arts and Humanities Arkansas Arts Council, but shall have no vote on matters coming before the advisory council.
- 5 (b) The executive director's salary and expenses of his <u>or her</u> office 6 shall be fixed by the General Assembly within amounts available therefor by 7 appropriation.
 - (c) The advisory council may, by resolution duly adopted, delegate to the executive director any of the powers and duties vested in or imposed upon it by this subchapter, and the delegated powers and duties may be exercised by the executive director in the name of the office agency.

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- SECTION 7. Arkansas Code § 13-8-106 is amended to read as follows: 14 13-8-106. Powers and duties.
- 15 (a) The Office of Arkansas State Arts and Humanities Arkansas Arts
 16 Council shall be the official agency of the State of Arkansas for the
 17 development and coordination of a comprehensive statewide program for the
 18 arts and humanities. In general, but not by way of limitation, the Advisory
 19 Council of the Office of Arkansas State Arts and Humanities Arkansas Arts
 20 Council shall have and exercise the following powers and duties:
- 21 (1) To advise the Governor and General Assembly of the State of 22 Arkansas on matters relating to the arts and humanities;
 - (2) To hold both public and private hearings for the purpose of furthering the objectives of this subchapter and to promulgate and adopt rules and regulations for the performance of its duties hereunder;
 - United States or any agency or instrumentality thereof having duties or functions similar to the office agency, with private associations or corporations, with private or public colleges or universities, with any public or private school, or with individual persons for any purpose consistent with the objectives and purposes of this subchapter; and
- 32 (4) To do any and all other acts or things as may be deemed 33 necessary and convenient by the advisory council to foster and promote the 34 development of the arts and humanities in this state.
- 35 (b) The <u>office agency</u>, through the advisory council, shall establish 36 and carry out a program of grants-in-aid to groups or, in appropriate cases,

- to individuals engaged in or concerned with the arts for the purpose of enabling them to provide or support in Arkansas:
- 3 (1) Productions which have substantial artistic and cultural 4 significance, giving emphasis to creativity and the maintenance and
- 5 encouragement of professional excellence;

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- 6 (2) Projects that will encourage and assist artists and enable 7 them to achieve standards of professional excellence; and
- 8 (3) Other relevant projects, including surveys, research, 9 education, and planning in the arts.
- (c)(1) The <u>office agency</u> shall be the sole and official agency of this state to receive any funds allocated and disbursed to the State of Arkansas by the United States or any agency or instrumentality thereof pursuant to Public Law 89-209 entitled the National Foundation on the Arts and Humanities Act of 1965 as well as funds received for any program related to the arts and humanities and not expressly designated for some other state agency and to disburse the funds in accordance with the terms and conditions, if any,
- disburse the funds in accordance with the terms and conditions,
 relating to the grants.
 - (2) The Executive Director of the Office of Arkansas State Arts and Humanities Arkansas Arts Council shall be the Governor's liaison officer to implement Public Law 89-209, entitled the National Foundation on the Arts and Humanities Act of 1965.
- 22 (3) All programs of grants-in-aid as described in this section 23 shall be administered by the executive director.
 - (d) The <u>office agency</u> shall be the sole and official agency of this state authorized to accept and receive, in addition to federal grants, any money and real and personal property donated, bequeathed, or devised for any purpose relating to the development and expansion of the arts and humanities and not expressly designated for some other state agency and to disburse and utilize those gifts for the purposes of this subchapter.
 - (e) The office agency is authorized to establish and collect reasonable fees for, but not limited to, advertising in newsletters and requested mailing list labels. The fees collected shall be deposited in a financial institution in this state and shall be used to support services that conform to the purposes of this subchapter.
- 35 (f) The <u>office agency</u> shall submit an annual report to the Governor as 36 of June 30 of each year, summarizing the <u>office's agency's</u> activities,

1	expenditures, and grants of money or property from all sources for the
2	preceding year. This report shall include recommendations directed toward
3	furthering the purposes of this subchapter as the office agency deems
4	appropriate.
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
