Arkansas Code 16-32-201(b) is amended to read as follows: 3 4 (b) Circuit courts to which criminal cases are assigned may call grand 5 jurors from the wheel or box from which petit jurors are drawn, or the 6 circuit judge may direct the jury commissioners to provide the minimum number 7 of names for a separate grand jury wheel or box in the minimum number set 8 forth in § 16-32-103(a)-(d). In the event the circuit judge directs the jury 9 commissioners to provide the minimum number of names for a separate grand 10 jury wheel or box, the jury commissioners shall select the names of persons 11 whom they believe to be qualified from the current voter registration compiled list of registered voters, licensed drivers, and persons issued 12 13 identification cards under § 27-16-805, who are citizens of the United States 14 and eighteen (18) years of age or older.

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16 SECTION 3. <u>The Department of Finance and Administration shall no later</u> 17 <u>than October 31 of each year provide to the circuit clerk of each county a</u> 18 <u>list of all persons licensed by the department to operate motor vehicles and</u> 19 <u>persons issued identification cards under § 27-16-805, who are citizens of</u> 20 <u>the United States, eighteen (18) years of age or older, and who reside within</u> 21 <u>the counties which the circuit clerk serves.</u> 22
