9 (b) The owner of a vehicle not required to be inspected under any 10 provision set forth in subsection (a) of this section which requires a 11 commercial driver license to operate, and which is used for the purposes of 12 transporting passengers to and from school, church or church-related 13 activities, child or adult day care facilities, senior citizen facilities, 14 for transporting persons with disabilities or any other vehicle required by 15 federal law to be inspected, shall cause such vehicle to be annually 16 inspected for safety and approved for operation. The vehicle owner shall 17 deliver the vehicle to a vehicle maintenance or repair facility regularly engaged in the business of repairing and maintaining vehicles of the type 18 19 required to be inspected for safety, and request that the vehicle be 20 inspected to determine if the vehicle is in safe operating condition. The 21 cost of the safety inspection shall be an amount mutually agreed upon between 22 the vehicle owner and the owner or operator of the repair facility prior to performing the inspection. Provided, however, the cost of such inspection 23 24 shall not exceed seventeen dollars and fifty cents (\$17.50). 25 (c) Upon completion of the inspection the person conducting the 26 inspection shall complete and give to the vehicle owner an inspection report, 27 on a form designated by the Director of the Arkansas State Police. Such 28 report shall be maintained in the vehicle at all times, and shall be provided 29 to any law enforcement officer for review or inspection upon request. 30 (d) It shall be the responsibility of the vehicle owner to obtain the 31 necessary form. The form may be obtained from the Arkansas State Police or 32 state revenue offices. Forms will also be provided by the Arkansas State 33 Police to any vehicle maintenance or repair facility as requested. Forms will also be mailed by the Arkansas State Police to individuals upon request. 34 35 (e) Failure to comply with this section, or any rules or regulations promulgated by the Director of the Arkansas State Police for the purposes of 36
