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2	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General		
3	Assembly of the State of Arkansas that revenue available for the support of		
4	necessary state services has declined during the last twelve months as a		
5	result of the nationwide economic slowdown; that without reducing the		
6	administrative expenses of the Department of Finance and Administration, some		
7	state services will be reduced or eliminated; and that this bill will reduce		
8	administrative expenses associated with certified mail in order to avoid the		
9	reduction in necessary services. Therefore, an emergency is declared to		
10	exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the		
11	public peace, health, and safety shall become effective on:		
12	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;		
13	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,		
14	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the		
15	bill; or		
16	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is		
17	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
