- 8 Committee is ruled unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction,
- 9 this entire section is void.
- 10 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001 July

- 13 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 14 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. QUARTERLY
- 15 REPORTS. Due to the critical role of the Health and Safety and Medical Cost
- 16 Containment Programs to the overall programs of the Workers' Compensation
- 17 Commission (WCC), the WCC shall provide quarterly reports to the Arkansas
- 18 Legislative Council and to the House and Senate Committees on Public Health,
- 19 Welfare, and Labor on the progress of the Health and Safety Program and the
- 20 Medical Cost Containment Program, in such detail as may be required by either
- 21 body. These reports shall be posted on the agency's web page.
- The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001
- 23 July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2003 June 30, 2005.

- 25 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. Arkansas Code 11-9-703 concerning
- 26 preliminary conference procedures for the Workers Compensation Commission is
- 27 amended to add a new subdivision to read as follows:
- 28 (5) No monies appropriated by Act 1046 of 1987 or any other Act shall be
- 29 expended to fund preliminary conferences held pursuant to Arkansas Code 11-9-
- 30 102, 11-9-205, 11-9-501 503, 11-9-517, 11-9-521 522, 11-9-527, 11-9-701 -
- 31 704, 11-9-715, 11-9-802, 11-9-804 other than in the county where the accident
- 32 occurred, if the same occurred in this State, the county of the claimant's
- 33 residence, or such other county as agreed to by the parties.

- 35 SECTION 11. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 36 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. MANAGED

- 1 CARE IMPLEMENTATION. Implementation of Workers' Compensation Commission Rule
- 2 33 (Managed Care) shall be voluntary for all employers.
- 3 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001
- 4 July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2003 June 30, 2005.

- 6 SECTION 12. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
- 7 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. WORKERS'
- 8 COMPENSATION COVERAGE. Municipalities with populations over one hundred
- 9 fifty thousand (150,000) citizens or their sewer committees are specifically
- 10 authorized to provide workers' compensation coverage for their officials and
- 11 employees through either private carriers or by self-funding on either a
- 12 statewide or individual basis.
- 13 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2001
- 14 <u>July 1, 2003</u> through <del>June 30, 2003</del> <u>June 30, 2005</u>.

- 16 SECTION 13. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE NOR PUBLISHED
- 17 SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND BALANCES WORKER'S
- 18 COMPENSATION FUND, DEATH AND PERMANENT TOTAL DISABILITY TRUST FUND AND SECOND
- 19 INJURY TRUST FUND. (A) For all appropriations as provided in this Act, the
- 20 agency disbursing officer shall monitor the level of fund balances in
- 21 relation to expenditures on a monthly basis. If any proposed expenditures
- 22 would cause the Worker's Compensation Fund to decline below four million
- 23 twenty five thousand five hundred ninety one dollars (\$4,025,591), the Death
- 24 and Permanent Total Disability Trust Fund to decline below sixty eight
- 25 million, six thousand five hundred fifty one dollars (\$68,006,551) or the
- 26 Second Injury Trust Fund to decline below five million four hundred nine
- 27 thousand six hundred six dollars (\$5,409,606) a fund balance to decline to
- 28 less than fifty percent (50%) of the balance available on July 1, 2001, the
- 29 disbursing officer shall immediately notify the executive head of the agency.
- 30 Prior to any obligations being made under these circumstances, the agency
- 31 head shall file written documentation with the Chief Fiscal Officer of the
- 32 State requesting approval of the expenditures. Such documentation shall
- 33 provide sufficient financial data to justify the expenditures and shall
- 34 include the following:
- 35 1) a plan that clearly indicates the specific fiscal impact of such
- 36 expenditures on the fund balance.

- 1 2) information clearly indicating and explaining what programs would be cut
- 2 or any other measures to be taken by the agency to restore the fund balance.
- 3 3) the extent to which any of the planned expenditures are for one-time costs
- 4 or one-time purchase of capitalized items.
- 5 4) a statement certifying that the expenditure of fund balances will not
- 6 jeopardize the financial health of the agency, nor result in a permanent
- 7 depletion of the fund balance.
- 8 (B) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall review the request and
- 9 approve or disapprove all or any part of the request, after having sought
- 10 prior review by the Legislative Council.
- 11 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003
- 12 through June 30, 2005.

- 14 SECTION 14. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
- 15 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
- 16 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
- 17 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
- 18 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
- 19 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
- 20 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
- 21 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
- 22 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

23

- 24 SECTION 15. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
- 25 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
- 26 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
- 27 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
- 28 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
- 29 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
- 30 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
- 31 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

- 33 SECTION 16. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
- 34 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
- 35 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
- 36 <u>effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of</u>

1	the agency for which the appropriations in this act are provided, and that in
2	the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
3	date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the
4	proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
5	Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
6	necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
7	safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003.
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
