17	SECTION 2. <u>Requirements for delivery sales.</u>
18	(a) No person may make a delivery sale of cigarettes to any individual
19	who is under the legal minimum purchase age.
20	(b) Each person accepting a purchase order for a delivery sale shall
21	comply with:
22	(1) The age verification requirements in section 3;
23	(2) The disclosure requirements in section 4;
24	(3) The shipping requirements in section 5;
25	(4) The registration and reporting requirements in section 6;
26	(5) The tax collection requirements in section 7; and
27	(6) All other laws of this state generally applicable to sales
28	of cigarettes that occur entirely within this state, including, but not
29	limited to, those laws imposing:
30	(A) Excise taxes;
31	(B) Sales taxes and revenue-stamping requirements; and
32	(C) Escrow payment obligations in Arkansas Code §§ 26-57-
33	<u>260 and 26-57-261.</u>
34	
35	SECTION 3. Age verification requirements.
36	(a) No person shall mail, ship, or otherwise deliver cigarettes in

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1	connection with a delivery sale unless, prior to the first delivery sale to a
2	consumer, the person:
3	(1) Obtains from the prospective consumer a certification that
4	includes:
5	(A) A reliable confirmation that the consumer is at least
6	the legal minimum purchase age;
7	(B) A statement signed by the prospective consumer in
8	writing that certifies the prospective consumer's address;
9	(C) A reliable confirmation that the prospective consumer
10	understands that signing another person's name to the certification is
11	illegal, that the sale of cigarettes to individuals under the legal minimum
12	purchase age is illegal, and that the purchase of cigarettes by individuals
13	under the legal minimum purchase age is illegal;
14	(D) A statement that the prospective consumer wants to
15	receive mailings from a tobacco company;
16	(2) Makes a good faith effort to verify the information
17	contained in the certification provided by the prospective consumer against a
18	commercially available database, or obtains a photocopy or other image of a
19	valid, government issued identification stating the date of birth or age of
20	the individual placing the order;
21	(3) Provides to the prospective consumer, by e-mail or other
22	means, a notice that meets the requirements of section 4; and
23	(4) In the case of an order for cigarettes pursuant to an
24	advertisement on the Internet, receives payment for the delivery sale from
25	the prospective consumer by a credit or debit card that has been issued in
26	the consumer's name or by check.
27	(b) A person accepting purchase orders for delivery sales may request
28	that a prospective consumer provide his or her e-mail address.
29	
30	SECTION 4. Disclosure requirements.
31	The notice required under section 3(a)(3) shall include a prominent and
32	clearly legible statement that:
33	(1) Cigarette sales to consumers below the legal minimum
34	purchase age are illegal;
35	(2) Consists of one of the warnings set forth in section $4(a)(1)$
36	of the Federal Cigarette Labeling and Advertising Act, 15 U.S.C. § 1333(a)(1)

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1	as it existed on January 1, 2003, rotated on a quarterly basis;
2	(3) Sales of cigarettes are restricted to those consumers who
3	provide verifiable proof of age in accordance with section 3; and
4	(4) Cigarette sales are subject to tax under the Arkansas
5	Tobacco Products Tax Act of 1977 as amended, and an explanation of how the
6	tax has been, or is to be, paid with respect to the delivery sale.
7	
8	SECTION 5. Shipping requirements.
9	(a) Each person who mails, ships, or otherwise delivers cigarettes in
10	connection with a delivery sale:
11	(1) Shall include as part of the shipping documents a clear and
12	conspicuous statement as follows: "Cigarettes: Arkansas Law Prohibits
13	Shipping to Individuals Under Eighteen (18) Years of Age, and Requires the
14	Payment of all Applicable Taxes";
15	(2) Shall use a method of mailing, shipping, or delivery that
16	obligates the delivery service to:
17	(A) Require the consumer placing the purchase order for
18	the delivery sale, or an adult of legal minimum purchase age residing at the
19	consumer's address, to sign to accept delivery of the shipping container; and
20	(B) If the person appears to be under twenty-seven (27)
21	years of age, furnish proof, in the form of a valid government issued
22	identification bearing a photograph of the individual who signs to accept
23	delivery of the shipping container, that he or she is either the addressee or
24	an adult of legal minimum purchase age residing at the consumer's address;
25	and
26	(3) Shall provide to the delivery service evidence of full
27	compliance with section 7.
28	(b) If the person accepting a purchase order for a delivery sale
29	delivers the cigarettes without using a delivery service, the person shall
30	comply with all requirements of this act applicable to a delivery service and
31	shall be in violation of the provisions of this act if he or she fails to
32	comply with any requirement.
33	
34	SECTION 6. <u>Registration and reporting requirements</u> .
35	(a) Prior to making delivery sales or mailing, shipping, or otherwise
36	delivering cigarettes in connection with any delivery sales, a person shall

1	file with the Department of Finance and Administration a statement setting
2	forth the person's name, trade name, and the address of the person's
3	principal place of business and any other place of business and shall pay to
4	the department a registration fee in an amount equal to the amount paid by an
5	<u>Arkansas licensee.</u>
6	(b) Not later than the tenth day of each calendar month, each person
7	who has made a delivery sale or mailed, shipped, or otherwise delivered
8	cigarettes in connection with any delivery sale during the previous calendar
9	month shall file with the department a memorandum or a copy of the invoice
10	that provides for each delivery sale:
11	(1) The name and address of the consumer to whom the delivery
12	sale was made;
13	(2) The brand or brands of the cigarettes that were sold in the
14	delivery sale; and
15	(3) The quantity of cigarettes that were sold in the delivery
16	sale.
17	(c) Any person who satisfies the requirements of § 376 of Title 15 of
18	the United States Code as it existed on January 1, 2003, shall be deemed to
19	satisfy the requirements of this section.
20	
21	SECTION 7. <u>Collection of taxes.</u>
22	Each person accepting a purchase order for a delivery sale shall
23	collect and remit to the Department of Finance and Administration all
24	cigarette taxes imposed by the state with respect to the delivery sale,
25	except that the collection and remission shall not be required to the extent
26	the person has obtained proof, in the form of the presence of applicable tax
27	stamps or otherwise, that the taxes already have been paid to the state.
28	
29	SECTION 8. <u>Penalties.</u>
30	(a)(1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a first violation
31	of any provision of this act shall be an unclassified misdemeanor punishable
32	by a fine of one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or five (5) times the retail value
33	of the cigarettes involved, whichever is greater.
34	(2) A second or subsequent violation of any provision of this
35	and shall be an unalgorified mindemeaned numinhable by a fine of fine
	act shall be an unclassified misdemeanor punishable by a fine of five

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1	cigarettes involved, whichever is greater.
2	(b) Any person who knowingly and falsely submits a certification under
3	section 3(a)(1) in another person's name, shall, for each offense, be deemed
4	to have committed an unclassified felony and be fined ten thousand dollars
5	(\$10,000) or five (5) times the retail value of the cigarettes involved,
6	whichever is greater, or imprisoned not more than five (5) years, or both.
7	(c) Any person failing to collect or remit to the department any tax
8	required in connection with a delivery sale shall be assessed, in addition to
9	any other penalty, a penalty of five (5) times the retail value of the
10	cigarettes involved.
11	(d)(1) Any cigarettes sold or attempted to be sold in a delivery sale
12	that do not meet the requirements of this act shall be forfeited to the state
13	and destroyed.
14	(2) All fixtures, equipment, and all other materials and
15	personal property on the premises of any person who, with the intent to
16	defraud the state, violates any of the requirements of this act shall be
17	forfeited to the state.
18	
19	SECTION 9. Enforcement.
20	The Attorney General or any person who holds a valid federal or State
21	of Arkansas permit to manufacture or import tobacco products may bring an
22	action in the appropriate court in this state to prevent or restrain
23	violations of this act by any person, or any person controlling the person.
