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AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PROVIDING

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ADDITIONAL FUNDING AND APPROPRIATION TO THE TWO

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YEAR COLLEGES FOR EQUITY AND FULLY FUNDING

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EXISTING STUDENTS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF HIGHER

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EDUCATION FOR THE BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE 30,

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FORMULA FUND; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

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29 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:

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31 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - TWO YEAR COLLEGE MODEL FORMULA FUND. There is
32 hereby appropriated, to the Department of Higher Education, to be payable
33 from the Two Year College Model Formula Fund, for providing additional
34 funding and appropriation for transfer to the fund from which each of the
35 various two year colleges draws its general revenue support, for equity and
36 fully funding existing students, *first as set out in Section 2 of this Act*



1 and then based upon and in accordance with the computations included in the
 2 formula adopted and recommended by the Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating
 3 Board in July, 2002 for "The Greater of a Distribution Based on Mini-Model or
 4 a Distribution Based on a 2.7% Increase on General Revenue Portion of
 5 Salaries", by the Department of Higher Education for the biennial period
 6 ending June 30, 2005, the following:

14 SECTION 2. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 15 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TWO YEAR
 16 COLLEGE MODEL FORMULA FUND ALLOCATIONS-FIRST DISTRIBUTION. The Department of
 17 Higher Education shall transfer the following amounts of appropriation and
 18 funds as contained in Section 1 of this Act, or so much thereof as may be
 19 available, to the fund from which each of the various two year colleges draws
 20 its general revenue support:

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13 SECTION 3. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 14 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. TWO YEAR
 15 COLLEGE MODEL FORMULA FUND ALLOCATIONS. The Department of Higher Education
 16 shall transfer the following amounts of appropriation and funds as contained
 17 in Section 1 of this Act after making the distributions in Section 2 of this
 18 Act or so much as is available to the fund from which each of the various two
 19 year colleges draws its general revenue support, based upon and in accordance
 20 with the computations included in the formula adopted and recommended by the
 21 Arkansas Higher Education Coordinating Board in July, 2002 for "The Greater
 22 of a Distribution Based on Mini-Model or a Distribution Based on a 2.7%
 23 Increase on General Revenue Portion of Salaries":

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17 SECTION 4. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. TWO YEAR COLLEGE MODEL FORMULA FUND
18 CREATED. Arkansas Code Title 19, Chapter 5, Subchapter 3 is amended by adding
19 the following new subsection:

20 (aa) (1) Two Year College Model Formula Fund. There is established on the
21 books of the Treasurer of State, the Auditor of State and the Chief Fiscal
22 Officer of the State a fund to be known as the Two Year College Model Formula
23 Fund, there to be used for the distribution of funds to the various two year
24 colleges by the Department of Higher Education as may be authorized by law.

25 (2) The fund shall consist of:

26 (A) Such general revenues as may be provided by law; and

27 (B) Any other funds made available by the General Assembly.

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29 SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
30 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUNDING
31 RESTRICTIONS. If funding of any of the elements of the formula enumerated in
32 this act are provided through this or other legislation, then only the
33 remaining elements shall be financed through this act and only to the extent
34 necessary such that the additional funds, when added to the funds in this
35 act, do not exceed the appropriations provided herein.

36 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, 2003

1 through June 30, 2005.

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3 SECTION 6. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized
4 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds
5 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the
6 restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and
7 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary
8 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal
9 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by
10 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be
11 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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13 SECTION 7. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
14 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
15 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
16 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
17 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
18 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
19 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
20 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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22 SECTION 8. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
23 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
24 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
25 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2003 is essential to the operation of
26 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
27 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
28 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2003 could work irreparable harm upon the
29 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
30 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
31 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
32 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2003.
