1 (a)(1), the General Assembly shall stand in recess until on or before the 2 third Monday in February. 3 (B) During the recess set forth in subdivision (a)(2)(A), 4 the Joint Budget Committee shall meet and hold hearings as needed to 5 ascertain: 6 (i) The needs of each department of state government 7 and all of its agencies, institutions, and offices; 8 (ii) The number of employees required by each of 9 them; and 10 (iii) The necessary amount of money from public 11 funds required to carry on the work or functions of each department, agency, 12 institution, and office. 13 (C) The Joint Budget Committee shall before the third Monday of February or the last day of the recess prepare and submit to the 14 15 General Assembly an itemized budget for each department, agency, office, and 16 institution supported by the state government. 17 (b)(1) Following the November general election, a three-week presession budget hearing may be conducted by the Legislative Council and the 18 19 Joint Budget Committee to ascertain: 20 (A) The needs of a boards and commissions with money in 21 local financial institutions, commonly referred to as cash fund agencies; 22 (B) The number of employees required by each of the boards 23 and commissions set forth in subdivision (b)(1)(A); and 24 (C) The necessary amount of money from public funds 25 required to carry on the work or functions of the boards and commissions set 26 forth in subdivision (b)(1)(A). 27 (2) Before each session of the General Assembly, the Legislative 2.8 Council and the Joint Budget Committee shall prepare and submit to the 29 General Assembly an itemized budget for the cash fund agencies. 30 However, in any odd numbered year following the election of a nonincumbent governor, the General Assembly upon convening at 12:00 noon on the second 31 32 Monday in January may remain in session only for such time not to exceed two 33 (2) days as is necessary to open and publish the votes for various 34 constitutional offices, to swear in the state constitutional officers and 35 members of the General Assembly, to organize and select officers, and to 36 otherwise prepare for the regular session. It may then stand in recess for a

1	period of not to exceed thirty (30) days.

4	10-3-307. Submission of itemized budgets to Legislative Council.		
5	All state agencies, departments, institutions, and offices shall submi		
6	to the Legislative Council <u>Joint Budget Committee</u> a budget for their		
7	operation in the manner and at the times as requested by the Legislative		
8	Council Joint Budget Committee. The Legislative Council shall ascertain the		
9	needs of each department of state government and all of its agencies,		
10	institutions, and offices; the number of employees required by each of them;		
11	and the necessary amount of money from public funds required to carry on the		
12	work or functions of any department, agency, institution, and office; and		
13	shall before each session of the General Assembly prepare and submit to the		
14	General Assembly an itemized budget for each department, agency, office, and		
15	institution supported by the state government.		
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
