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1 sale, issue, or delivery in this state, other than coverage limited to 2 expenses from accidents or specified diseases, whether an individual or group 3 policy, contract, certificate, or plan, which covers the insured and members 4 of the insured's family, shall include coverage for newborn infant children 5 by the insured from the moment of birth.

6 The coverage of newborn children shall be the same as is provided (2) 7 for other members of the insured's family and shall include coverage for 8 illness, injury, congenital defects, premature birth, and tests for 9 hypothyroidism, phenylketonuria, and galactosemia, and, in the case of non-10 Gaucasian newborn infants, tests for sickle-cell anemia, and all other 11 disorders of metabolism for which screening is performed by or for the State of Arkansas, as well as any testing of newborn infants hereafter mandated by 12 13 law, and subject to minimum benefits required by § 23-99-404, shall also 14 include coverage to pay for routine nursery care and pediatric charges for a 15 well newborn child for up to five (5) full days in a hospital nursery or 16 until the mother is discharged from the hospital following the birth of the 17 child, whichever is the lesser period of time. 18
