1	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that present law pertaining to
2	price gouging does not adequately address the circumstances of terrorists
3	attacks and war; that this act enhances the price gouging laws of this state
4	to cover those situations; and that the imminent prospect of war and further
5	terrorists attacks dictate that this act should go into effect as soon as
6	possible. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being
