1	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
2	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that revenue available for the
3	support of necessary state services has declined during the last twelve
4	months as a result of the nationwide economic slow down; that without
5	additional revenue, some state services will be reduced or eliminated; that
6	some Arkansans will suffer as a result of service reductions or cuts; and
7	that this bill will provide necessary revenue to avoid state service
8	reductions or cuts. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this
9	act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace,
10	health, and safety shall become effective on July 1, 2003.
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
