2	SECTION 2. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the		
3	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that revenue available for the		
4	support of necessary state services has declined during the last twelve		
5	months as a result of the nationwide economic slow down; that without		
6	additional revenue, some state services will be reduced or eliminated; that		
7	some Arkansans will suffer as a result of service reductions or cuts; and
