9 CODE PERTAINING TUITION CHARGES; AND FOR OTHER

## Subtitle

12 AN ACT TO AMEND OBSOLETE PROVISIONS OF  
13 ARKANSAS CODE PERTAINING TUITION  
14 CHARGES.  
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19 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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21 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-65-105 is amended to read as follows:  
22 6-65-105. Tuition - Admissions.

23 (a) The tuition in each school shall be ~~free~~ determined by the board  
24 of trustees.

25 (b) The trustees may limit the number of students from time to time  
26 according to the capacity and means of the institution and shall make such  
27 rules of admission as to equalize, as nearly as practicable, the privileges  
28 of the school among the counties according to population.

29 (c) No students under the age of fifteen (15) years shall be admitted  
30 as students at these schools.  
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32 SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-65-212 is amended to read as follows:  
33 6-65-212. Beebe Branch - Tuition and admissions.

34 (a) The tuition in the school shall be ~~free~~ determined by the board of  
35 trustees.

36 (b) The trustees may limit the number of students from time to time



1 according to the capacity and means of the institution and shall make such  
2 rules of admission as to equalize as nearly as practical the privileges of  
3 the school among the counties composing the district according to population.

4 (c) No student under the age of fifteen (15) years shall be admitted  
5 as a student of this school.

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7 SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
8 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Code contains  
9 language that is obsolete; that other states with similar obsolete language  
10 have been forced to engage in legal matters relating to the oversight; and  
11 that this act is immediately necessary because a delay in implementation  
12 would cause a disruption in the educational programs of this state and the  
13 ability to provide certain agricultural related programs. Therefore, an  
14 emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for  
15 the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become  
16 effective on:

17 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

18 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,  
19 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the  
20 bill; or

21 (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is  
22 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.

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
