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21	WHEREAS, the State of Arkansas is in global competition for capital
22	investment, from domestic and foreign-based entrepreneurs and from domestic
23	and foreign-based corporations; and
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25	WHEREAS, our state, to remain competitive, must continually reassess
26	and review the economic development policies that attract investment to
27	Arkansas; and
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29	WHEREAS, the General Assembly has in the past appointed committees to
30	review existing economic development and to make recommendations for future
31	legislative action; and
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33	WHEREAS the Eighty-Third General Assembly authorized a study of the
34	states' economic development incentives; and
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36	WHEREAS, the Fluor-Daniel study found, during the 2001-2002 interim,



that the State of Arkansas is at a competitive disadvantage with regard to its policy of taxing energy used in the manufacturing process; and WHEREAS, there are only a few states in the United States that impose such charges on the economic engines located in their respective states, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That the General Assembly requests the House and Senate Interim Committees on Agriculture, Forestry, and Economic Development to study the economic development value of creating tax exemptions on energy used in the manufacturing process. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the House and Senate Interim Committees on Agriculture, Forestry, and Economic Development make recommendations concerning the economic investment potential of tax exemptions on energy used in the manufacturing process and present a comprehensive report of the findings to the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Eighty-Fifth General Assembly. 2.8
