22	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE

24	MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:

26	That the following is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of
27	the State of Arkansas, and upon being submitted to the electors of the state
28	for approval or rejection at the next general election for Senators and
29	Representatives, if a majority of the electors voting thereon at the
30	election, adopt the amendment, the amendment shall become a part of the
31	Constitution of the State of Arkansas, to wit:

33	SECTION 1. Section 5 of Article 5 of the Constitution of the State of
34	Arkansas is amended to read as follows:
35	§ 5. Time of meeting.
36	The General Assembly shall meet at the seat of government every two



years on the first Tuesday after the second Monday in November until said each year on the second Monday in January until the time be altered by law. SECTION 2. Section 17 of Article 5 of the Constitution of the State of Arkansas is amended to read as follows: § 17. Duration of sessions. The regular biennial annual sessions shall not exceed sixty forty-five (45) days in duration, unless by a vote of two-thirds of the members elected to each house of said the General Assembly. Provided, that this section shall not apply to the first session of the General Assembly under this Constitution, or when impeachments are pending. SECTION 3. This amendment becomes effective January 1, 2005.
