1	§ 5. Time of meeting.		
2	<u>(a)</u> The General Assembly shall meet at the seat of government <del>every</del>		
3	<del>two years on the first Tuesday after the second Monday in November until said</del>		
4	time be altered by law at the time prescribed by law during each odd numbered		
5	year and each even numbered year.		
6	(b)(1) The General Assembly may consider any issue within the		
7	legislative authority of the General Assembly during the regular session held		
8	in odd numbered years, including, but not limited to, bills enacting new		
9	laws, bills amending, revising, and changing present laws, bills		
10	appropriating funds, bills restricting the use of funds, bills raising or		
11	decreasing revenues, bills of an emergency nature, certifying the results of		
12	the general elections, proposing amendments to the Arkansas Constitution,		
13	confirming appointments made by the Governor, and impeachments.		
14	(2) Only bills restricting the use of funds, bills to raise or		
15	decrease revenues, bills of an emergency nature, proposed amendments to the		
16	Arkansas Constitution, confirmation of appointments made by the Governor, and		
17	impeachments may be acted upon during the regular session held in even		
18	numbered years.		
19	(c) In addition to extraordinary sessions called by the Governor,		
20	extraordinary sessions of the General Assembly may be convened as provided by

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23	SECTION 2. Article 5, Section 17 of the Constitution of the State of

26	<u>(a)(1)</u> The regular <del>biennial</del> sessions <u>held during odd numbered years</u>		
27	shall not exceed sixty (60) legislative days in duration during a period of		
28	eighty-five (85) calendar days, unless by a vote of two-thirds of the members		
29	elected to each house of <del>said</del> <u>the</u> General Assembly <u>the number of legislative</u>		
30	days, calendar days, or both are extended.		
31	(2) A legislative day is a calendar day when either house of the		
32	General Assembly is in session.		
33	(b) The regular sessions held during even numbered years shall not		
34	exceed thirty (30) legislative days in duration during a period of sixty (60)		
35	calendar days, unless by a vote of two-thirds of the members elected to each		
36	house of the General Assembly the number of legislative days, calendar days,
