26	THE TAXPAYERS PROTECTION AMENDMENT.
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29	BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE
30	STATE OF ARKANSAS AND BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES, A MAJORITY OF ALL
31	MEMBERS ELECTED TO EACH HOUSE AGREEING THERETO:
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33	That the following is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of
34	the State of Arkansas, and upon being submitted to the electors of the state
35	for approval or rejection at the next general election for Senators and
36	Representatives, if a majority of the electors voting thereon at the



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election, adopt the amendment, the amendment shall become a part of the Constitution of the State of Arkansas, to wit: SECTION 1. (a) Beginning January 1, 2005, the General Assembly may enact a law to levy a tax or fee or to increase the rate of any tax or fee only upon the affirmative vote of three-fifths (3/5) of the members elected to each house of the General Assembly unless the levy or increase requires a three-fourths (3/4) vote under Article 5, Section 38 of the Constitution. (b) The General Assembly shall not, after December 31, 2004, enact a law to decrease the rate of any tax or to provide a tax exemption, credit, exclusion, or deduction except upon the affirmative vote of a majority of the total membership elected to each house of the General Assembly. (c) The General Assembly shall not, after December 31, 2004, enact a law to remove a tax exemption, credit, exclusion, or deduction except upon the affirmative vote of three-fifths (3/5) of the members elected to each house of the General Assembly. SECTION 2. This amendment shall be known as the "Taxpayers Protection Amendment". SECTION 3. This amendment shall become effective January 1, 2005.
