WHEREAS, the State of Arkansas currently has no liver transplant program
available to its citizens; and
WHEREAS, the citizens of Arkansas must travel outside the state and
incur the expense of travel, meals, and lodging for extended periods of time
if they require a liver transplant; and
WHEREAS, a liver transplant program at the state's teaching hospital
can provide state-of-the-art health care for all citizens of the state; and
WHEREAS, the establishment of such a program provides opportunities for
training of future specialists, most of whom will stay in the state to
practice; and
WHEREAS, our citizens covered by Medicare currently must travel to
another state for a liver transplant and Arkansas Medicare dollars are
expended in that state to cover the cost of the transplant,



NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: That the Senate encourages the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences to establish and develop a nationally recognized program for liver transplants.
