9	RECOGNIZING THE NORTHERN CHEROKEE NATION OF

14	RECOGNIZING THE NORTHERN CHEROKEE NATION
15	OF MISSOURI AND ARKANSAS AS A STATE
16	RECOGNIZED NATIVE AMERICAN TRIBE.

18	WHEREAS, the people of the Northern Cherokee Nation of Missouri and
19	Arkansas are descendents of the original Cherokee Nation and settled in the
20	states of Arkansas and Missouri rather than in the Indian Territory; and
21	
22	WHEREAS, the Northern Cherokee Nation of Missouri and Arkansas has
23	continued a form of tribal government for the past one hundred forty (140)
24	years and in 1979 wrote a constitution and by-laws creating, beginning in
25	1982, a new and working tribal organization in Arkansas and Missouri; and
26	
27	WHEREAS, people of the Northern Cherokee Nation of Missouri and
28	Arkansas who are citizens of Arkansas have represented our state in the
29	United States Armed Services through several wars; and
30	
31	WHEREAS, recognition of the Northern Cherokee Nation of Missouri and
32	Arkansas as a state recognized Native American tribe confers benefits upon
33	the people of the Northern Cherokee Nation of Missouri and Arkansas, benefits
34	that include recognizing Northern Cherokee artists as Native American artists
35	under the Indian Arts and Crafts Act of 1990, Pub. L. No. 101-644, and the
36	Indian Arts and Crafts Enforcement Act of 2000, Pub. L. No. 106-497, and



providing access to scholarships for Native American youth, NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE EIGHTY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS: That the Northern Cherokee Nation of Missouri and Arkansas is recognized as a state recognized Native American tribe. BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this recognition does not authorize the establishment of any smoke shops of any kind, does not authorize the establishment of any tribal casinos or gaming of any kind, does not authorize the establishment of any pari-mutuel waging, and does not give the Northern Cherokee Nation of Missouri and Arkansas, as an organization, any additional rights or powers other than those contained in the Arkansas Constitution.
