18	SECTION 1. Arkansas C	ode § 3-7-104(6)(A), reg	arding the rate of tax on	
19	alcoholic beverages sold in the state, is amended to read as follows:			
20	(6)(A) A tax at the rate of seven dollars and fifty cents			
21	(\$7.50) fifteen dollars (\$15.00) per barrel of thirty-two (32) gallons, and			
22	proportionately for larger and smaller gallonages per barrel, on all beer			
23	having an alcoholic content of five percent (5%) or less by weight sold or			
24	offered for sale in the State of Arkansas.

26	SECTION 2. Arkansas C	ode § 3-7-104(7), regard	ing the rate of tax on	
27	alcoholic beverages sold in	the state, is amended to	read as follows:	
28	(7) A tax at th	e rate of twenty cents (20¢) <u>forty cents (40¢)</u> on	
29	each gallon of malt liquor s	old or offered for sale	in the State of Arkansas.

31	SECTION 3. EMERGENCY	CLAUSE. It is found and	determined by the	
32	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the state is experiencing			
33	budget shortfalls due to a decline in the economic conditions in the state;			
34	that additional revenue is n	that additional revenue is needed to fund essential services; that without		
35	the additional tax levied under this act, the state will be forced to cut			
36	programs and services that assist the most needy citizens of the State of			

1	Arkansas; and that this act is immediately necessary to levy additional
2	excise taxes on alcoholic beverages to prevent state programs and services
3	from being cut. Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act
4	being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety
5	shall become effective on July 1, 2003.
