4	SECTION 4. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the
5	General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that the Arkansas Supreme Court in
6	Lake View School District No. 25 v. Huckabee, 351 Ark. 31 (2002) declared the
7	current system of education to be unconstitutional because it is both
8	inequitable and inadequate; and the Arkansas Supreme Court set forth the test
9	for a constitutional system to be one in which the State has an "absolute
10	duty" to provide an "equal opportunity to an adequate education"; the
11	Arkansas Supreme Court instructed the General Assembly to undertake actions
12	as necessary to provide an opportunity for an adequate and equitable
13	education for the children of Arkansas; and the provisions of this bill are
14	necessary steps toward accomplishing that goal. Therefore, an emergency is
15	declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the
16	preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall become effective
17	<u>on:</u>
18	(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;
19	(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor,
20	the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the
21	bill; or
22	(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is
23	overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
