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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:		
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21	SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 6-15-1601 is amended to read as follows:		
22	6-15-1601. Establishment of committee commission-Members.		
23	(a) There is established a committee commission to be known as the		
24	Committee Commission on Clo	sing the Achievement Gap in	Arkansas.
25	(b) The <del>committee</del> <u>co</u>	<u>mmission</u> shall consist of tw	velve (12) members as
26	follows:		
27	(1) Four (4) p	ersons appointed by the Gove	ernor:
28	(A) One	(1) of the Governor's appoin	ntees shall be a member
29	of the faculty of an historically black college in the state who has		
30	demonstrated an interest in and commitment to working with disadvantaged		
31	youth;		
32	(B) One	(1) of the Governor's appoin	ntees shall be an
33	Hispanic who has demonstrated a commitment to education;		
34		(1) of the Governor's appoin	
35	-	and industry in Arkansas; ar	
36	(D) One	(1) of the Governor's appoin	ntees may be a

- 2 (2)(A) Four (4) persons appointed by the President Pro Tempore

- 17 (c)(1) Upon taking office, the members shall draw lots to determine
- 18 the length of their terms.
- 19 (2) The initial terms of office shall be staggered terms such
- 20 that:
- 21 (A) One (1) member appointed by each officer shall have an
- 22 initial term that expires in 2005;
- 23 (B) One (1) member appointed by each officer shall have an
- 24 initial term that expires in 2006; and
- 25 (C) One (1) member appointed by each officer shall have an
- 26 initial term that expires in 2007.
- 27 (3) Subsequent appointments shall be for a term of four (4)
- 28 years.
- 29 (d)(1) If a vacancy occurs in an appointed position for any reason,
- 30 the vacancy shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment.
- 31 (2) The new appointee shall serve for the remainder of the
- 32 unexpired term.
- 33 (e) The Governor shall designate one (1) of his or her appointees to
- 34 serve as chair for the first year. Thereafter, the <del>committee</del> commission
- 35 members shall annually elect a chair from among themselves.
- 36 (f)(1) The committee commission shall meet at times and places the

2 (2) No meetings shall be held outside the State of Arkansas. 3 (3) A majority of the members of the committee commission shall 4 constitute a quorum for the purpose of transacting business. 5 (4) All action of the committee commission shall be by a 6 majority vote of the full membership of the committee commission. 7 The committee commission shall: 8 (1) Develop a plan for the state designed to enable all public school students to meet the state's student academic achievement standards 9 10 while working toward the goal of narrowing the achievement gaps in public 11 schools for the following subgroups: 12 (A) Economically disadvantaged students; and 13 (B) Students from major racial and ethnic groups; 14 (2)(A) Monitor the Department of Education's efforts to comply 15 with federal guidelines on improving the academic achievement of the 16 disadvantaged, specifically including, but not limited to, the No Child Left 17 Behind Act of 2001. 18 (B) Monitor the department's identification of population 19 groups to be motivated in closing the achievement gap efforts. The committee commission may expand the role and scope 20 21 of the committee commission to cover specific population groups as identified 22 by the department as target groups for closing the achievement gaps; and 2.3 (3) File a report with the chairs of the House Interim Committee 24 on Education and the Senate Interim Committee on Education, the Governor, and 25 the State Board of Education no later than November 1 of each year. 26 The committee commission may study and address topics, including, 27 but not limited to: 28 Understanding children of poverty; (1) 29 (2) Successful strategies with students of poverty; 30 (3) Teacher preparation for student diversity; 31 (4) Response to language diversity; 32 (5) Methods of hiding the achievement gap; 33 (6) Success stories; 34 Obstacles to overcome in closing the achievement gap; (7) (8) Alternative intervention strategies for closing the 35 36 achievement gap;

14	(B) Members of the committee commission may receive		
15	expense reimbursement in accordance with § 25-16-902, to be paid by the		
16	department to the extent that money is available.		
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18	SECTION 2. Arkansas Code § 6-15-1604(a) is amended to read as follows:		
19	(a) The State Board of Education shall report annually to the Joint		
20	Interim Oversight Subcommittee on Educational Reform and the Committee		
21	<u>Commission</u> on Closing the Achievement Gap in Arkansas on the numbers of		
22	students who have dropped out of school, been suspended, expelled, or placed		
23	in an alternative program.		
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
