6	(a) During the 2004-2005 school year, the Department of Education		
7	shall establish three (3) pilot programs to study the educational effects of		
8	reducing teacher-student ratios in, respectively, grades:		
9	(1) Kindergarten through three (K-3);		
10	(2) Four through eight (4-8); and		
11	(3) Nine through twelve (9-12).		
12	(b)(1) The Department of Education shall select sixteen (16)		
13	elementary schools for the pilot project for grades kindergarten through		
14	three (K-3).		
15	(2) The Department of Education shall select four (4) schools		
16	from each congressional district with the following characteristics:		
17	(A) One (1) school in each congressional district from a		
18	school district with each of the following enrollment categories:		
19	(i) Five thousand (5,000) or more students;		
20	(ii) One thousand five hundred (1,500) to four		
21	thousand nine hundred ninety-nine (4,999) students;		
22	(iii) Seven hundred fifty (750) to one thousand four		
23	hundred ninety-nine (1,499) students; and		
24	(iv) Below seven hundred fifty (750) students;		
25	(B) At least two (2) classes at each grade from grades		
26	kindergarten through three (K-3); and		
27	(C) Pilot and control classes composed of substantially

19	(B) The Department of Education shall determine the
20	specific course and grade levels to be studied in the pilot project.
21	(2) The department shall select two (2) schools from each
22	congressional district ratios with the following characteristics:
23	(A) One (1) school in each congressional district from a
24	school district with each of the following enrollment categories:
25	(i) Five thousand (5,000) or more students to one
26	thousand five hundred (1,500); and
27	(ii) Fewer than one thousand four hundred ninety
28	nine (1,499) students;
29	(B) At least two (2) classes at each grade from grades
30	nine through twelve (9-12); and
31	(C) Pilot and control classes composed of substantially
32	percentages of students who:
33	(i) Qualify for free or reduced-lunch fees; or
34	(ii) Are below two hundred percent (200%) of the

36	(e)(1) The Department of Education shall consult with the Department

1	of Higher Education to select one (1) Arkansas university to assist and study
2	the pilot project schools in each congressional district.
3	(2)(A) Each selected university shall appoint a qualified
4	faculty member or graduate student to represent the university in the pilot
5	project.
6	(B) Each selected university shall provide the selected
7	faculty member or graduate student with sufficient release time to assist
8	effectively in the project.
9	(f)(1) After the pilot project schools and universities have been
10	selected, the Department of Education shall convene a meeting of persons from
11	each school and university to outline the pilot research project.
12	(2) The meeting shall be held during the summer of 2004 to
13	prepare for the 2004-2005 school year.
14	(3) In consultation with the Department of Education, the
15	research group shall outline the details of a pilot program that will meet
16	research standards necessary to draw valid conclusions based on the outcome
17	data from the project.
18	(4) During the project year, the research groups may meet as the
19	members deem necessary.
20	(g)(1)(A) Each university shall prepare a report on the pilot project
21	for the public schools under study by that university.
22	(B)(i) Early in the project year, the pilot project
23	schools and universities shall design a format for the reports.
24	(ii) The final report from all schools shall employ
25	the format designed under subdivision (g)(1)(B)(i) of this section.
26	(2) The Department of Education shall compile a summary report
27	covering all the pilot project schools.
28	(h) On or before September 1, 2005, the Department of Education shall
29	report the results of the pilot project to the Governor, the State Board of
30	Education, the Legislative Council, and the House and Senate Interim
31	Committees on Education.
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
