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36	SECTION 2. DISBURS	EMENT CONTROLS. (A) No contract may be	awarded nor		

- l obligations otherwise incurred in relation to the project or projects
- 2 described herein in excess of the State Treasury funds actually available
- 3 therefor as provided by law. Provided, however, that institutions and
- 4 agencies listed herein shall have the authority to accept and use grants and
- 5 donations including Federal funds, and to use its unobligated cash income or
- 6 funds, or both available to it, for the purpose of supplementing the State
- 7 Treasury funds for financing the entire costs of the project or projects
- 8 enumerated herein. Provided further, that the appropriations and funds
- 9 otherwise provided by the General Assembly for Maintenance and General
- 10 Operations of the agency or institutions receiving appropriation herein shall
- 11 not be used for any of the purposes as appropriated in this act.

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- 29 SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly
- 30 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
- 31 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
- 32 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
- 33 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
- 34 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
- 35 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
- 36 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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2	SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General		
3	Assembly, that a pilot study is necessary to ensure that reducing the		
4	teacher-student ratio from one-to-twenty to one-to-fifteen in grades		
5	kindergarten through three actually improves student performance before		
6	committing millions of dollars to reduce the ratio without knowing the effe		
7	it would have in Arkansas schools. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared		
8	to exist and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the		
9	public peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and		
10	after the date of its passage and approval. If the bill is neither approved		
11	nor vetoed by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of		
12	the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill		
13	is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become		
14	effective on the date the last house overrides the veto.		
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
