## For An Act To Be Entitled

9 AN ACT TO MAKE AN APPROPRIATION FOR PERSONAL  
10 SERVICES AND OPERATING EXPENSES FOR THE  
11 DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION - OFFICE OF TEACHER  
12 RECRUITMENT FOR THE BIENNIAL PERIOD ENDING JUNE  
13 30, 2005; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

23 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
24

25 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES - OFFICE OF TEACHER RECRUITMENT. There is  
26 hereby established for the Department of Education - Office of Teacher  
27 Recruitment for the 2003-2005 biennium, the following maximum number of  
28 regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of the  
29 Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et  
30 seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however,  
31 that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein  
32 in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform  
33 Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions  
34 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular  
35 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its  
36 successor.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION - OFFICE OF TEACHER RECRUITMENT. There is hereby appropriated, to the Department of Education, to be payable from the Department of Education Public School Fund Account, for personal services and operating expenses of the Department of Education - Office of Teacher Recruitment for the biennial period ending June 30, 2005, the following:

SECTION 3. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the restrictions of the State Purchasing Law, the General Accounting and Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

SECTION 4. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral

1 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or  
2 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

4 SECTION 5. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General  
5 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the  
6 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that due to the  
7 November 2002 Supreme Court ruling concerning the Lake View School District  
8 No. 25 v. Huckabee, et al., that the effectiveness of this Act on the date of  
9 its passage and approval is essential to the operation of the agency for  
10 which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in the event of  
11 an extension of the Second Extraordinary Session, the delay in the effective  
12 date of this Act beyond the date of its passage and approval could work  
13 irreparable harm upon the proper administration and provision of essential  
14 governmental programs. Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist  
15 and this Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public  
16 peace, health and safety shall be in full force and effect from and after the  
17 date of its passage and approval. If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed  
18 by the Governor, it shall become effective on the expiration of the period of  
19 time during which the Governor may veto the bill. If the bill is vetoed by  
20 the Governor and the veto is overridden, it shall become effective on the  
21 date the last house overrides the veto.
