Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and 28 29 safety shall become effective on: 30 (1) The date of its approval by the Governor; 31 (2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, 32 the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the 33 bill; or (3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is 34 35 overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto. /s/ Walters, et al 36
