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25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:
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27 SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - AUDITOR OF STATE DISBURSEMENTS. There is hereby
28 appropriated, to the Auditor of State, to be payable from the Constitutional
29 Officers Fund, for personal services and operating expenses of the Auditor of
30 State - General Appropriations for the biennial period ending June 30, 2007,

 4 appropriated, to the Arkansas House of Representatives, to be payable from
 5 the Constitutional Officers Fund, for reimbursements to Representatives for
 6 interim expenses incurred as authorized by law of the Arkansas House of
 7 Representatives for the biennial period ending June 30, 2007, the following:

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13 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - ARKANSAS SENATE. There is hereby appropriated,
 14 to the Arkansas Senate, to be payable from the Constitutional Officers Fund,
 15 for reimbursements to Senators for interim expenses incurred as authorized by
 16 law of the Arkansas Senate for the biennial period ending June 30, 2007, the
 17 following:

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23 SECTION 4. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 24 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY
 25 FORWARD. Any unexpended balance in the appropriations authorized for Interim
 26 Expense Reimbursements for Representatives and for Interim Expense
 27 Reimbursements for Senators which remain at the close of the fiscal year
 28 ending ~~June 30, 2004~~ June 30, 2006 shall be carried forward and made
 29 available for the same purposes for the fiscal year ending ~~June 30, 2005~~ June
 30 30, 2007.

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32 SECTION 5. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. The
 34 Auditor of State shall be disbursing officer for the funds appropriated in
 35 Section 1 herein.

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1 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 2 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SENATE
 3 DISBURSEMENTS. The Secretary of the Senate/Fiscal Officer shall be
 4 disbursing officer for the funds appropriated for Interim Expense
 5 Reimbursements for Senators herein.

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 7 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. HOUSE
 9 DISBURSEMENTS. The Coordinator of House Legislative Services of the House of
 10 Representatives shall be disbursing officer for the funds appropriated for
 11 Interim Expense Reimbursements for Representatives herein.

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 13 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 14 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. HOUSE
 15 INTERIM EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENTS. The appropriations authorized in Section 2
 16 shall be used for making reimbursements for interim expenses incurred by
 17 members of the House of Representatives.

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 19 SECTION 9. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 20 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. SENATE
 21 INTERIM EXPENSE DISBURSEMENTS. The appropriations authorized in Section 3
 22 shall be used for making reimbursements for interim expenses incurred by
 23 members of the Senate.

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 25 SECTION 10. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS
 26 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW.
 27 LEGISLATIVE INSTITUTE. Members of the preceding General Assembly and the
 28 newly elected members of the House of Representatives and Senate shall be
 29 eligible to attend the biennial Institute of Legislative Procedure and shall
 30 be entitled, upon filing claim therefor, to per diem in the amount fixed by
 31 law for members of the General Assembly to receive for attendance at
 32 Legislative sessions, for each day in attending the biennial Institute of
 33 Legislative Procedure plus mileage for traveling from their place of
 34 residence to the biennial Institute of Legislative Procedure and return.

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 36 SECTION 11. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly

1 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained
2 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act
3 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations
4 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by
5 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral
6 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or
7 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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9 SECTION 12. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General
10 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the
11 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the
12 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of
13 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in
14 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective
15 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the
16 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.
17 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being
18 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and
19 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.

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
