## For An Act To Be Entitled

9 AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT AN ELECTED PUBLIC OFFICIAL  
10 WHO IS A MEMBER OF THE ARKANSAS PUBLIC EMPLOYEES'  
11 RETIREMENT SYSTEM AT THE TIME OF THE MEMBER'S  
12 ELECTION TO A PUBLIC OFFICE IN ANOTHER FORM OF  
13 GOVERNMENT MAY RETIRE AND BEGIN RECEIVING  
14 RETIREMENT BENEFITS UPON TERMINATION OF THE LOCAL  
15 ELECTED OFFICE; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

18 ELECTED PUBLIC OFFICIALS WHO ARE MEMBERS  
19 OF APERS AND WHO ARE ELECTED TO PUBLIC  
20 OFFICE IN ANOTHER FORM OF GOVERNMENT MAY  
21 RETIRE AND RECEIVE BENEFITS WITHOUT A  
22 BREAK IN SERVICE.  
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25 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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27 SECTION 1. Arkansas Code § 24-4-520 is amended to read as follows:  
28 24-4-520. Termination required for retirement.

29 (a) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, a member  
30 of the Arkansas Public Employees' Retirement System must terminate covered  
31 employment to be eligible for retirement.

32 (b) A member shall not be terminated from employment for retirement  
33 purposes if the person:

34 (1) Returns to employment in a position covered under the system  
35 within thirty (30) days of the person's effective date of retirement; or

36 (2) Is a member with service credit under ~~§ 24-3-301~~ § 24-4-521



1 at a rate of two (2) or more years of credited service for each year of  
 2 actual service and the person returns to employment in a position covered  
 3 under the system within ninety (90) days of the person's effective date of  
 4 retirement.

5 (c)(1) An elected public official may retire and begin receiving  
 6 retirement benefits if the elected public official is a member:

7 (A) Whose current service in public office in one form of  
 8 government is covered by § 24-4-521(b)(5); and

9 (B) Who is elected to public office in a different form of  
 10 government and will begin serving in that public office immediately after the  
 11 expiration of his or her term of public office described in subdivision  
 12 (c)(1)(A) of this section.

13 (2) The member shall notify the retirement system of his or her  
 14 impending service in another form of government at least thirty (30) days  
 15 prior to the first day of the month in which that service will begin. A  
 16 completed retirement application must be submitted at that time.

17 (3) As used in this subsection, "form of government" means city  
 18 government, county government, or state government.

19 ~~(e)~~(d) Persons failing to meet termination requirements shall forfeit  
 20 their benefits until requirements are met.

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 22 SECTION 2. Section 1 of this act shall apply retroactively to an  
 23 elected public official who meets the requirements of § 24-4-520(c) as of  
 24 January 1, 2005.

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 26 SECTION 3. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the  
 27 General Assembly of the State of Arkansas that there are elected public  
 28 officials that are eligible for retirement from that office but run for  
 29 public office in another form of government; that once a retiree begins  
 30 receiving retirement benefits current law requires a break in service before  
 31 assuming another elected office; and that this act will allow an elected  
 32 public official in one form of government to retire and to begin serving as  
 33 an elected official in another form of government without a break in service.  
 34 Therefore, an emergency is declared to exist and this act being immediately  
 35 necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety shall  
 36 become effective on:

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(1) The date of its approval by the Governor;

(2) If the bill is neither approved nor vetoed by the Governor, the expiration of the period of time during which the Governor may veto the bill; or

(3) If the bill is vetoed by the Governor and the veto is overridden, the date the last house overrides the veto.
