15 AN ACT FOR THE OIL AND GAS COMMISSION  
16 APPROPRIATION FOR THE 2005-2007  
17 BIENNIUM.

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21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS:  
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23 SECTION 1. REGULAR SALARIES. There is hereby established for the Oil and  
24 Gas Commission for the 2005-2007 biennium, the following maximum number of  
25 regular employees whose salaries shall be governed by the provisions of the  
26 Uniform Classification and Compensation Act (Arkansas Code §§21-5-201 et  
27 seq.), or its successor, and all laws amendatory thereto. Provided, however,  
28 that any position to which a specific maximum annual salary is set out herein  
29 in dollars, shall be exempt from the provisions of said Uniform  
30 Classification and Compensation Act. All persons occupying positions  
31 authorized herein are hereby governed by the provisions of the Regular  
32 Salaries Procedures and Restrictions Act (Arkansas Code §21-5-101), or its  
33 successor.

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21 SECTION 2. EXTRA HELP. There is hereby authorized, for the Oil and Gas  
 22 Commission for the 2005-2007 biennium, the following maximum number of part-  
 23 time or temporary employees, to be known as "Extra Help", payable from funds  
 24 appropriated herein for such purposes: six (6) temporary or part-time  
 25 employees, when needed, at rates of pay not to exceed those provided in the  
 26 Uniform Classification and Compensation Act, or its successor, or this act  
 27 for the appropriate classification.

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29 SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION - OPERATIONS. There is hereby appropriated, to  
 30 the Oil and Gas Commission, to be payable from the Oil and Gas Commission  
 31 Fund, for personal services and operating expenses of the Oil and Gas  
 32 Commission for the biennial period ending June 30, 2007, the following:

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16 SECTION 4. APPROPRIATIONS - REFUNDS AND TRANSFERS. There is hereby  
 17 appropriated, to the Oil and Gas Commission, to be payable from cash funds as  
 18 defined by Arkansas Code 19-4-801 of the Oil and Gas Commission, for refunds  
 19 and transfers to the State Treasury of the Oil and Gas Commission for the  
 20 biennial period ending June 30, 2007, the following:

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26 SECTION 5. APPROPRIATIONS - WELL PLUGGING PROGRAM. There is hereby  
 27 appropriated, to the Oil and Gas Commission, to be payable from the Abandoned  
 28 and Orphan Well Plugging Fund, for well plugging program expenses of the Oil  
 29 and Gas Commission for the biennial period ending June 30, 2007, the sum  
 30 of.....\$1,500,000.

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32 SECTION 6. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
 33 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. CARRY  
 34 FORWARD. Any unexpended balance of the appropriation authorized for Data  
 35 Processing in Item (06) of Section 3 of this Act which remains at the close  
 36 of the fiscal year ending June 30, ~~2004~~ 2006, shall be carried forward and

1 made available for the same purpose for the fiscal year ending June 30, ~~2005~~  
2 2007, after having sought prior review by the Arkansas Legislative Council or  
3 the Joint Budget Committee.

4 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2003~~  
5 2005 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

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7 SECTION 7. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS  
8 CODE NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND  
9 BALANCES. OIL AND GAS COMMISSION FUND. (A) For all appropriations as  
10 provided in this Act, the agency disbursing officer shall monitor the level  
11 of fund balances in relation to expenditures on a monthly basis. If any  
12 proposed expenditures would cause the Oil and Gas Commission Fund to decline  
13 below nine hundred seven thousand, four hundred eighty-seven dollars  
14 (\$907,487.00), the disbursing officer shall immediately notify the executive  
15 head of the agency. Prior to any obligations being made under these  
16 circumstances, the agency head shall file written documentation with the  
17 Chief Fiscal Officer of the State requesting approval of the expenditures.  
18 Such documentation shall provide sufficient financial data to justify the  
19 expenditures and shall include the following:

- 20 1) a plan that clearly indicates the specific fiscal impact of such  
21 expenditures on the fund balance.  
22 2) information clearly indicating and explaining what programs would be cut  
23 or any other measures to be taken by the agency to restore the fund balance.  
24 3) the extent to which any of the planned expenditures are for one-time costs  
25 or one-time purchase of capitalized items.  
26 4) a statement certifying that the expenditure of fund balances will not  
27 jeopardize the financial health of the agency, nor result in a permanent  
28 depletion of the fund balance.

29 (B) The Chief Fiscal Officer of the State shall review the request and  
30 approve or disapprove all or any part of the request, after having sought  
31 prior review by the Legislative Council.

32 The provisions of this section shall be in effect only from July 1, ~~2003~~  
33 2005 through June 30, ~~2005~~ 2007.

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35 SECTION 8. SPECIAL LANGUAGE. NOT TO BE INCORPORATED INTO THE ARKANSAS CODE  
36 NOR PUBLISHED SEPARATELY AS SPECIAL, LOCAL AND TEMPORARY LAW. FUND TRANSFER.

1 Immediately upon the effective date of this Act, the Chief Fiscal Officer of  
2 the State shall transfer \$750,000 on his or her books and the books of the  
3 State Treasurer and the Auditor of the State from the Oil and Gas Commission  
4 Fund to the Abandoned and Orphan Well Plugging Fund.

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6 SECTION 9. COMPLIANCE WITH OTHER LAWS. Disbursement of funds authorized  
7 by this act shall be limited to the appropriation for such agency and funds  
8 made available by law for the support of such appropriations; and the  
9 restrictions of the State Procurement Law, the General Accounting and  
10 Budgetary Procedures Law, the Revenue Stabilization Law, the Regular Salary  
11 Procedures and Restrictions Act, or their successors, and other fiscal  
12 control laws of this State, where applicable, and regulations promulgated by  
13 the Department of Finance and Administration, as authorized by law, shall be  
14 strictly complied with in disbursement of said funds.

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16 SECTION 10. LEGISLATIVE INTENT. It is the intent of the General Assembly  
17 that any funds disbursed under the authority of the appropriations contained  
18 in this act shall be in compliance with the stated reasons for which this act  
19 was adopted, as evidenced by the Agency Requests, Executive Recommendations  
20 and Legislative Recommendations contained in the budget manuals prepared by  
21 the Department of Finance and Administration, letters, or summarized oral  
22 testimony in the official minutes of the Arkansas Legislative Council or  
23 Joint Budget Committee which relate to its passage and adoption.

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25 SECTION 11. EMERGENCY CLAUSE. It is found and determined by the General  
26 Assembly, that the Constitution of the State of Arkansas prohibits the  
27 appropriation of funds for more than a two (2) year period; that the  
28 effectiveness of this Act on July 1, 2005 is essential to the operation of  
29 the agency for which the appropriations in this Act are provided, and that in  
30 the event of an extension of the Regular Session, the delay in the effective  
31 date of this Act beyond July 1, 2005 could work irreparable harm upon the  
32 proper administration and provision of essential governmental programs.  
33 Therefore, an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this Act being  
34 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and  
35 safety shall be in full force and effect from and after July 1, 2005.
